A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS Definitive Treaties of Peace and Friendship between Us, the States General of the United Provinces, and the United States of America, have been concluded at Paris, and the Ratifications thereof duly exchanged : In Conformity thereunto, We have thought fit hereby to command, That the fame be published throughout all Our-Dominions: And We do declare to all Our loving Subjects Our Will and Pleafure, that the faid Treaties of Peace and Friendship be observed inviolably, as well by Sea as Land, and in all Places whatfoever; firicity charging and commanding all our loving Subjects to take Notice hereof, and sonform themfelves thereunto accordingly.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Second Day of July, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, in the Twenty-fourth Year of Our Reign.

For a Publick Thankfgiving.

GEORGE R.

THEREAS it has pleafed Almighty God in His Great Goodnefs to put an End to the late Bloody, Extended, and Expensive War in which We were engaged; We therefore, adoring the Divine Goodnels, and duly confidering that the Great and Bublick Bleffings of Peace do call for Publick and Solemn Acknowledgements, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, That a General Thankf-giving to Almighty God for thefe His Mercies be obferved throughout England, Wales, and the Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Thurfday the Twenty-ninth Day of this inftant July: And for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to this Occafion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of Publick Worfhip, and to take Care for the timely difperting of the fame throughout their refpective Diocefes: And We do strictly charge and command that the faid Publick Day of Thanksgiving be religiously observed by all our loving Subjects; as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of fuffering fuch

Punishment as We can justly inflict upon all such who shall contemn or neglect the fame.

W HE REAS it has pleafed Almighty God in His great Goodnefs to put an End to the late Bloody, Extended, and Expensive War in which We were engaged; We therefore, ador-ing the Divine Goodnefs, and duly confidering that the Great and Publick Bleffings of Peace do call for Publick and Solemn Acknowledgements, have thought fit, by the Advice of Out Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that a Ge-neral Thankfgiving to Almighty God, for thefe His Mercies, be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Create Privil and Sorthan Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, upon Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant July; and We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Thankfgiving be re-verently and decently obferved by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the faid Twenty-ninth Subjects in Scotland, on the faid Twenty-minth Day of this inftant July, as they tender the Fa-vour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punifhment as We may juftly inflict on all fuch as contemn or neglect the Performance of for religious a Duty: Our Will and Pleafure is therefore, and We charge, that incontinent this Our Proclamation feen, ye pais to the Market Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance : And Our Will and Placfure is that Our Solicitor do conform Inat none pretend ignorance: And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the fe-veral Shires, Stewarts of Stewarties, and Bailiffe of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom we ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Doubles thereof to the feveral Parocki-Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Doubles thereof in the Double and the Bourd's Day immediately preceding the Day above-men-tioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.
