AS feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, s contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abaratis of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who -may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that shey extend to those who are any ways concerned or inftrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Mamifacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Person shall constact with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and fhall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Weftminster, er at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three

Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-ion having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and im-

prifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Perlon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador. &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfon shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and fhall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of Peace that any Perfon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefly's Dominions, for the Purpofes afore-faid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice ; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may band him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions: And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpose aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Mäjesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Berfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indicament at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, .&c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Seotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Are tificer contracted with, or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impriforment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry
