A. PROCLAMATION: RUTLAND,

HEREAS His Majesty hath been pleased , to iffee His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date at His Court at St. James's the 2d Day of this Instant July, in the Words following, viz.

By the KING. PROCLAMATION,

WHEREAS Definitive Treaties of Peace and Friendship between Us, the States General of the United Provinces, and the United States of America, have been concluded at Paris, and the Katifications thereof duly exchanged: In Con-Formity there ato, We have thought fit hereby to command, That the same be published throughout all Our Dominions: And We do declare to all Our loving Subjects Our Will and Pleasure, that the said Treaties of Peace and Priendship be observed inviolably, as well by Sea as Land, and in all Places whatsoever; strictly charging and commanding all Our loving Subjects to take Notice hereof, and conform themselves thereunto accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty hath signified His Royal Pleasure, that the said Proclamation be forthwith published within this Kingdom in the usual Manner; We do therefore, in Obedience to His Majesty's faid Commands, hereby publish His Majesty's said Royal Proclamation accordingly; strictly charging and commanding all His Majesty's Loving Subjects to take Notice thereof, and to conform themselves according to the Tenor of the faid Proclamation.

GOD Save the KING.

St. James's, July 10.
AS several Artificers and Manusasturers, Subjects
of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or in: strumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Ma. nufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Expor-ation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute & George I. Chap. 27.

other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreight Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seifions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and im-prisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within 57x Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Aitificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by fuch Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Person shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alen, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Jultice of Peace that any Person is endeavour ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purposes aforesaid; such Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Assizes or Quarter Seffions: And if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the fustice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any such Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any such Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court thall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indistment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indicament in the Court of Justiciary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Ar-IF any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ire-tany Artiscer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or land; the Person so convicted shall, for every Ar-wiscer Contracted with, or seduced, for seit FIVE HUNDRED

HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-fonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Ossender shall be convicted, for I welve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such

Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Manishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufacturers or any Part of such Tools, he shall for every Offence forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts, in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize

and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall for every such Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fusier to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the same to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and also forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any. Office

under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.
