When they came to the Castle Gate, after the Serjeant Trampeter had founded a Call thrice, Athlone Pursuivant made an O'yes, and Ulster King of Arms read His Majesty's Proclamation aloud; the Procession then continued to the Tholsel, Corn Market, Old-Bridge, Ormond-Bridge, and Essex Bridge; at which Places the Proclamation was read by Ulster in the same Manner: The Spectators, who were very numerous at each Place, expressed their Satisfaction by loud Acclamations. During the Procession the Guns in the Park were fired three Rounds of Twenty one Guns; and the Evening was concluded with ringing of Bells, Bonfires, and other Demonstrations of Joy.
