WHEREAS it bas been bumbly represented to the King That on Thursday the 15th Instant, a most considerable Quantity of Tea and Foreign Spirits was run on Shore near Christ Church, within the Limits of the Port of Southampton, from Two large Lug fail Vessels, by a numerous Gang of Smuglers, in Defiance of the Laws of the Revenue, and in Opposi-tion to the Officers of His Majesty's Customs employed in the Execution thereof, who, notwithstanding their utmost Endeavours, were unable to reself so large a faid James Adair, Esq; and his Wife, and to burn his Body of desperate and armed Men:

That upon Information being received that the said at the House of the said James Adair, Esq; above Two Smugling Vessels had taken Shelter in Christ mentioned, on the 20th Day of this Instant July, and utmost Endeavours, were unable to resist so large a

Church Harbour, an Attempt was made, on the Evening of the said 15th Instant, by the Officers and Crew His Majesty's Sloop of War the Orestes, in Conjunction with the Officers of the Swan Cutter, in the Service of the Customs, and of a Cutter in the Service of the Excise, in their respective Boats, manned and armed, to seize and take Possession of the said Smugling Veffels:

I hat in the Execution of this Service they were most wielently and forcibly resisted by a large Body of Smuglers, armed with Fire Arms and other offensive Weapons, who were affembled on board the faid Veffels, and on Shore, for that Purpose, and who fired upon the Officers, and killed Mr. William Allen, the Master of the said Sloop of War the Orestes, (who, by wirtue of a Commission from the Board of Customs, was likewise an Officer of that Revenue) and also dangerously wounded one of the Bout's Crew:

That the Officers however resolutely persevered in the Execution of their Duty, boarded and seized both the said Smugling Vessels, and, after having taken Possession thereof, carried them into the Port of Cowes; but that the Persons concerned in this atrocious Out-

rage and Murder made their Escape.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned therein, is belieby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the said Offenders (except the Person who adjustly fired and killed the said Mr. Allen) who shall discover his Accomplices, so that Two or more of them may be apprehended and convisted of the said Offence.

And, as a farther Encouragement, the Commissioners His Majesty's Customs do hereby offer a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any Two or more of the said Offenders, to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs upon Conviction.

And if any one of the faid Offenders shall, within Three Months from the Date hereof, discover his Accomplices, so that two of them at least be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence, the Offender making such Discovery shall be entitled to the like Reward.

. General-Post-Office, July 22, 1784. BY an Act of the last, and also one of the present Seffion of Parliament, for establishing certain Regulations concerning the Portage and Conveyance of Letters and Packets by the Post between Great Britain and Ireland, to take Place on the Ass of August next, all Letters and Packets are to be charged and paid for according to the present Rates of Postage in Great Britain, and the Rates established by the Act of Parliament in Ireland, except to and from certain Per-fons rubo, by Virtue of the respective Offices in Great Brigain and Ireland, now fend and receive Letters and Patient and reliand, now join and release Letters and Packets free from the Duty of Postage, provided that all such Letters and Packets so sent shall relate to the Business of their respective Offices, and that there shall be certified on the Outside of such Letters and Rackets, under the Hand Writing of such Officers respectively to be On His Majesty's Service, and that such Letters and Packets shall be sealed with the Seal of the Office, or or Officer fending the Same. And in Case any Such Officers shall receive under Cover to them any Letters or Packets intended for or directed to other Persons, all such Officers are required to send the same to the General Post Office in London, or Dublin, in order that such Letters and Packets may be charged with the Duty of Postage; it being the true Intent and Meaning of this Ast, that the Privilege of Sending and receiving Let-ters and Packets by Such Officers, shall extend to Such Letters and Packets only, as relate to the Business of their respective Offices.

It is a so enacted, That all Persons may send printed Votes, Proceedings in Parliament, and printed News Popers to and from Great Britain and Ireland, at the Rate of One Penny only for each printed Vote, Proceeding in Parliament, and each printed News Paper, in Covers open at Both Ends, to be paid when they are put into any Post-Office in Great Britain; but the Penny need not be paid before band upon Papers from Ireland, as it can be received on their Delivery in Great

It is likewise enacted, That His Majesty's Postmaster-General may authorize certain Persons to send and receive printed Votes, Proceedings in Parliament, and printed News Papers by the Post to and from Great Britain and Ireland, at the Rate of One Penny only for each printed Vote, and Proceeding in Parliament, and each printed News Paper, over and above the printed Price thereon.

All Persons therefore who wish to be supplied with News Papers for Ireland, or from Ireland for Great Britain, may have them regularly sent, by applying by Letter, or otherwise, to the Clerk of the Chester Road, at the General Post-Office in London, or to the Postmaster of any Town in Great Britain, where a News Paper is printed; or to the Secretary of the General Post-Office in Dublin.

NFORMATION having been transmitted, by Order of the Court of France, to the Marquess of Carmarthen, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Foreign Department, that several of His Majesty's Subjects, in the underwritten List particularly mentioned, have been, for a considerable Time, and are now detained in France, as Hostages for the Payment of Ransom Bills, which have not yet been satisfied; These are to give Notice, that in Case such Ransom-Bills are not forthwith discharged, Prosecutions will be commenced in His Majesty's Court of Admiralty against all Masters, Owners, and others, unjustly resuling or neglecting to pay the Sums of Money stipulated for the Release of those unfortunate Persons, who have suffered so long an Imprisonment.

AS feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms: The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them—And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or intrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries; out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Assizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Person having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being such Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majerty's Dommions, to exercise or teach the said Trades to foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the said Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artisicers shall be, or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; such Person shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Descent, Devise or Purchase; and shall forseit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's Use, and shall be deemed Alven, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavour-ing to seduce any such Artificer, or that any such Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid; fuch Justice may send his Warrant to bring the Person complained of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, such Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if such Person shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Assizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Arnificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpose aforesaid, he shall give such Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the same shall be prosecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there. IF any Person shall contract with, or endeavour to seduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Weitminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Justiciary; of any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indiament or Information in the King's Benell at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in treland; the Person so convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impriforment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Ossender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid: And in Case of a subsequent Offence of the same Kind, the Persons so again offending shall forseit, for every Person contracted with or seduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the Common Gao! of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender. shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until such Forseiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any such Tools or Utensils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manusacturers or any Part of such Tools, he shall for every Offence forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts, in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. shall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to seize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as such Officer shall sind on goard any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools so seized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly sold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall seize and secure the same.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the said Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall for every such Ossence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties instituted upon Persons exporting the Tools; and if the Vessel belongs to His Majesty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ircland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or sign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting

of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly suffer the same to be done, he shall forsel ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforesaid, and also forselt his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.
