IRISH LIFE ANNUITIES, With Benefit of Survivorship.

THE Subscribers to the Life Annuities, which commenced the 25th of March, 1778, according to a Resolution of the House of Commons of Ireland, Session 1777, and provided for by an Act of Parliament, Session 1779, who are to be paid in London, may receive Six Months Annuity, at Midsummer last, at Messrs. Boldero, Kendall, Adey, and Co. Bankers, No. 77, Lombard-street, in the following Manner, viz.
