WHEREAS it has been reprefented to Us, That on the Siverset That on the Sixtcenth Day of July last, a great Number of diforderly Perfons, armed with Fire Arms, affembled themfelves at the North End, of Deal in Our County of Kent, and being fo affembled and armed, forcibly obstructed, resisted, and fired upon the Crews of the Boats acting under the Orders of Lieutenant Bray, in Parfuit of a Galley rowed with Six Oars, contrary to the Statute in that Cafe made and provided : And whereas it has also been recrefented to Us, that on the Second Day of Auguit last, a great Number of diforderly Perfons, armed with Fire Arms, affembled themfelves at Deal aforefaid, and forcibly obstructed the Officers and Men of the Boats belonging to the Ship Scout, afting under the Orders of Captain Lindfay, and endeavouring to seize a Lugger, suspected of carrying on illicit Trade; and that William Russel, a Seaman be-longing to the Scout, was, by fome Perfon or Perfons fo armed and affembled, fhot in the Execution of his Duty: We therefore, being deeply fenfible of the many mischievous Confequences that must inevitably ensue to the Peace of Our Kingdom, the Collection of the Publick Revenue, and the Lives of Our loving Subjects, from fuch wicked and daring Outrages, if they shall go un-punished, and in order to deter all others from committing the like for the future, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We

do hereby strictly charge and command all Magiftrates, and other Civil Officers whatfoever, and all other Our Subjects, to be aiding and aflifting, to the utmost of their Power, in suppressing fuch illegal and tumultuous Affemblies, and in detect ing, apprehending, and bringing to Justice, the Perfons concerned in infligating the fame, and guilty of any of the Violence's before mentioned : And We do hereby promife and declare, That if any Perfon or Perfons concerned in tumultuoufly and forcibly refifting and obstructing the Officers and Men acting under the Orders of Lieutenant Bray, of Captain Lindfay, on the Sixteenth Day of July, or Second Day of August last, shall, on before the Twentieth Day of October next, and before fuch Perfon or Perfons shall be in Custody for the fame, discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any other Per-fon or Perfons who hath or have, or shall have been concerned in any of the faid heinous Offences, fo that he, fhe, or they may be convicted thereof, fuch Difcoverer or Difcoverers shall have Our most Gracious Pardon for the faid Offences; and, as a further Encouragement to fuch as shall difcover the faid Offenders, We do hereby further promise and declare, That any Person or Persons not in Cuttody as aforefaid, who fhall, on or before the faid Twentieth Day of October next, discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any of the Perfons concerned in the aforefaid tumultuous Affemblies, and forcible Refistance, fo as he, she, or they, may be convicted thereof, shall have and receive, for every Person so difcovered, apprehended, and convicted, the Sum of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS Sterling; which faid Sum of Two Hundred Pounds Sterling, for every such Offender so discovered and convicted, the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury for the Time being are hereby directed and required to pay a And laftly, We do hereby strictly charge and command all Our loving Subjects, that they do use their utmost Diligence and Endeavours, in their several Places and Stations, to find out, discover, and apprehend all such Offenders as aforesaid, upon Pain of Our higheft Difpleafure.
