HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Mesfage was fent to the Honourable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Affent to several Asts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Rates and Duties upon Bricks and Tiles made in Great Britain, and for laying additional Duties on Bricks and Tiles imported into the same.

An Act for laying an additional Duty on Hackney Coaches, and for explaining and amending several
Ass of Parliament relating to Hackney Coaches.

An Ast for granting to His Majesty an additional

Duty upon Licences for retailing Beer, Ale, and other Exciseable Liquors.

An Act for raifing a certain Sum of Money, by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and eighty-four.

An Act for granting to His Ma, efty certain Duties on Horfes kept for the Purpose of Rriding, and on Horfes used in drawing certain Carriages, in respect

whereof any Duty of Excise is made payable.

An Ast to postpone the Payment of the Sum of Two Millions, advanced by the Governor and Company of the Bank of England, towards the Supply for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and eighey-one.

An Act for the better Regulation and Management of the Affairs of the East India Company, and of the British Possissions in India; and for establishing a Court of Judicature for the more speedy and esfectual Trial of Persons accused of Ossences committed in the

An Ast to repeal so much of Two Asts, made in the Tenth and Fisteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to iffue his Warrants to the Clerk of the Crown for making out Writs for the Election of Mem-bers to serve in Parliament in the Manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other Provisions for the like Purposes.

An Act for vesting certain Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments in Trustees, for better securing His Ma-jesty's Docks, Sh ps, and Stores, at Portsmouth and Plymouth; and also for rewesting certain Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, in the Counties of Southampton, Cornwall, and Devon, in the former Proprietors thereof; and for other Purposes therein

An Act for authorifing the Treasurer of the Navy to pay to the Officers and Min belonging to His Majesty's Ship Santa Margaretta the like Bounty for taking the French Frigate called L'Amazone, as is allowed to the Officers and Men on Board any of His Majesty's Ships of War taking or destroying Ships of War belonging to the Enemy.

An Act to impower the Bishop of London, for the Time being, or any other Bishop, to be by him appointed, to admit to the Order of Deacon, or Prieft, Persons being Subjects or Citizens of Countries out of His Majesty's Dominions, without requiring them to

take the Oath of Allegiance as appointed by Law.

An At to continue the Term, and alter and enlarge the Powers, of an A.I., maie in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for amending, re-pairing, and widening several Roads in the Counties of Radnor and Hereford, and for repairing several other Roads in the Said Counties.

### PROCLAMATION.

For Discovering and Apprehending any of the Persons, who, on the Sixteenth Day of July last, and on the Second of this instant August, were concerned in unlawfully Opposing, Resisting, and Firing at the Officers employed in His Majesty's Revenue, while in the Execution of their Duty, at Deal in the County of Kent.

GEORGE R.

HEREAS it has been represented to Us, That on the Sixteenth Day of July last, a great Number of disorderly Persons, armed with Fire Arms, affembled themselves at the North End, of Deal in Our County of Kent, and being fo assembled and armed, forcibly obstructed, resisted, and fired upon the Crews of the Boats acting under the Orders of Lieutenant Bray, in Parfuit of a Galley rowed with Six Oars, contrary to the Statute in that Case made and provided: And whereas it has also been represented to Us, that on the Second Day of August last, a great Number of disorderly Persons, armed with Fire Arms, assembled themselves at Deal asoresaid, and sorcibly obstructed the Officers and Men of the Boats belonging to the Ship Scout, acting under the Orders of Captain Lindsay, and endeavouring to seize a Lugger, suspected of carrying on illicit Trade; and that William Russel, a Seaman belonging to the Scout, was, by some Person or Perfons so armed and assembled, shot in the Execution of his Duty: We therefore, being deeply fensible of the many mischievous Consequences that must inevitably ensue to the Peace of Our Kingdom, the Collection of the Publick Revenue, and the Lives of Our loving Subjects, from such wicked and daring Outrages, if they shall go un-punished, and in order to deter all others from committing the like for the future, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We
