Dublin, Novemb. 21.

HE first Notice of His Majefties Grations Intentions of a Marriage between the Lady Mary and the Prince of Orange, came bither on the sih of this Month, while we were, according to Custom, folemnizing the memory of that day. But the last Saturdays Pacquet having pronght us an Accounce of the Confummation of the fuld Marriage, it filled this flace with an extraordinary foy, and on Monday last his Grace the Duke of Ormond Lord Lifentenant of this Kingdom, and all the Nebility and Gontry ip Town, met in great splendor at the Play, where there pissed a general Invitation of all the Company, to Spend, that evening at the Casile. And while the Streets were everywhere filled with Bonstres, the Bells ringing, and all the great Smus of the City firing round, at the Casile there was Musick and Daneing. (The Ball being ended) there was proviled in the long Gallery a magnificent Banquet for the whole Company, who parted not till two a Gleck in the morning. And to morrow we fall repeat our foy, with like Solemnities, for the welcome News of the birth of the Duke of Cambridge. Naples, Novemb, 16. We hear not of any scion

Naples, Novemb. 16. We hear not of any adion in Sicily, the feason making a kind of Truce. The Spanish Gallies, and those of this Kingdom, are on their way hither from Palermo, being to winter here. One of the faid Gallies, who brought the Marquis de Beyonne, arrived some days since, who in her Voyage fell in the night in with a Squadron of 13Prench of Men of War, who were returning to Thoulon.

Vienna, Nov. 22. The Rebels demand a Ranfom of 25000 Crowns for the liberty of Colonel Boyer, of whole defeat and being taken prifoner you have already had an account (in that action 350 were killed, and about the fame number taken prifoners) and if that Sum be not paid very fuddenly, they threaten to put him to death, and even to that cruel one of being empaled. Count Harach, Ambafiador from the Emperor is arrived here. The news we have from Germany does not at all pleafe us.

Copenhagen, Nov. 30. Laft night arrived here an Express, who brought Letters from the Governor of Chriftianstadt, giving an account, that the Suedes had formed a defign to furprize the place on St. Martins Nighr, when they believed they within would be taken up with the ufual merriments and entertainments of shat day; that accordingly they approached the Town with a confiderable Body of Harle and Foot; which the Governor having notice of, he fent out a good parby, with orders to take the advantage that should be offered of falling upon the Enemyswho being approached near to the great Bridges they were fo warmly falused by the Cannon which the Governor had purpofely placed, that they were forced to retire in fome differtier. In their racreat the Party abavementioned did very much gaul them, and befides, another imall Body of Dragoons were fent out, whio, it's faid, did confiderable execution upon the Enemy; the particulars of cheir lofs we do not as yet know. The last account we had from the life of Rugen was, that there was no likelihuod of our Troops making themselves Masterso the Febr Scanz, which defends it felf well.

Straelfond, Nov. 30. Here are feveral in Town, who came lately from Stetin, they all report that the Befreged defend themfelves very well, and that they are refolved to expect a general Affault, which they believed the Elector would now make, having received a Succor of zogo Danes. On the 24th inflant 300 of the Befreged made a Sally, and furprized a final Man of War or Gally which lay in the Oder, the Captain happened to be killed, and the men, being wenty four, were catried into the Town. We are told that the Army of the Elector of Brandenburg is leffened by 7000 men, fince he fet down before Stetin; and at the fame time, much is fpoken of the conflancy of the Soldiers, who endure the hardthips of fo long a Siege, and all the incommodities of the fealon with great patience and refoliotion. The Danes in the file of Kugen, finding they could do no good upon the Febr Scant, have quitted the Siege, and are removed at a pretty diflance from it.

Hamburg, Decemb. 3. Out last Letters from the Camp before Stessin are of the 29 past, they tell us, that the Frost did very much incommode the Bestegers, that the Besteged had made so many Retrenchments within the Town, and had so well fortified feveral houses which shey had filled with Earth, that in all likelihood it would yet require time to take the place; part of the Danih Succoss were arrived in the Camp, and the reft daily expected.

Hague, Decemb. 7. Upon advice the States have received that St. Guiflain is belieged by the French, all their Cavalry is ordered to march, and their General the Count de Naffau is parted from hence in great diligence to command them. The States have caufed a Placaet to be published, giving notice that the Most Chriftian King has revoked the liberty he had granted for a free Filhery.

On Monday next it is expected their Highneffes will come hicher, against which time great preparation is making of Fireworks, by which will be reprefented feveral Figures, as that of a Drake, a Lion, a St. George on Hortzack, Fountains, Piramids, Flower Pors, Caffies, Trlumphal Chariots, Jupiter and Mars po defcending out of the Airs frc. and in all the Streets will be put up a great number of Pitchbarrils to make Bonfires, & c. The Letters we receive from Aniwerp, dated yesterday fay, That the day before, about eight in the morning, the Dake de Villa Hermosa parted from Bruffels, to put himself at the head of the Army, which had its Rendezvous on the other Ede of Hall, and to march to the relief St. Gui flain, which the French attacked with great fury. It was faid at Animerp that they had made two Affaults upon the place, and were as often repulfed with great lofs, buy it is with more certainty that they tell us, that they had beard very great fhooting all Tuefday and Wednefday night; that the Besiegers batter the place with 30 pie-ces of Canpon planted upon three Batteries ; that they had indeed taken one Redoubt, but that there remain ed another of far greater importance, which they had not yet made themfelves Maflers of.
