WEDNESDAY last being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, there was a numerous and splendid Appearance at Court of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties on the Occasion. At One o'Clock the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and other Public Demonstrations of Joy.
