A S feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings; contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Partiament of George the First and George the Second, to present such Practicesy are pailished for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be objerwed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or infirumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of the Fondoms, and in the Export ation of the Fools and Infiruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George 1. Chap. 27.

IF any Per on fhall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weftminfter, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Ferfon having been once convict, shall offend again, he fhall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &cc. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfon fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and shall forfeit all Lands,

Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to Hi Najelly's Ule, and thall be deemed Alen, and out or His Majelly's Protection.

Majetty's Protection. ⁴ Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of Peace that any Berlon is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majetty's Dominions, for the Purpoles aforefaid; fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it thall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confeffion, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear, at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions: And if fuch Perfon fhall refue to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he fhall be delivered, by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer thall be convicted upon Indiffment of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpole aforefaid, he fhall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court fhall think reafonable, and fhall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the same shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indiament or Information in the King's Bench at Wefminfter, or by Indiament at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fubfequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending hall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and thall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perlon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in. or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufacturers or any Part of such Tools, he shall for every Of-fence forfeit all such Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, 10 be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts, in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. fhali be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Brithin, of for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in some of His Majefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on goard any Vessel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to tome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized fhall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he shall for every fuch Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall alfo forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefly.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket of Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fime to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED FOUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majelty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

That Letters and Packets above two Poll Stages, and not exceeding 80 Miles, within England, fhall pay in Addition, Single 1 d. and fo in Proportion.

That Letters and Packets above 80, and not exceeding 150 Miles, within England, shall pay in

Addition, Single 1 d. and fo in Proportion. That Letters and Packets above 150 Miles; within England, fhall pay in Addition, Single 2d. and to in Proportion.

That Letters and Packets to or from the General Post-Office in London, to or from the City of Edinburgh, Dumfries and Cockburnspeth, shall pay in Addition, Single 1d. and fo in Proportion.

That Letters and Packets above one Poft Stage, and not exceeding 50 Miles, within Scotland, shall pay in Addition, Single 1 d. and fo in Proportion.

That Letters and Packets above 50, and not exceeding 80 Miles, within Scotland, shall pay in Addition, Single 1d. and fo in Proportion.

That Letters and Packets above 80, and not exceeding 150 Miles. within Scotland, that pay in Addition, Single 1 d. and fo in Proportion.

That Letters and Packets above 150 Miles, within Scotland, thall pay in Addition, Single zd. and fo in Proportion.

It is provided, that no Letter or Packet to or from Glafgow, or the intermediate Places by Carlifle, not paffing through London, fhall pay an. higher Rate than if fent through Edinburgh the or from Glafgow ; and that no Letter or Packet fant to or from Edinburgh, or any intermediate Place in England and Scotland, North of London, fhall pay an higher Rate than 7 d. for a Single Letter, and fo in Proportion.

It is further provided, that no Letter or Packet, together with its Contents, shall be taxed at an higher Rate than as a Treble Letter, unlefs it shall weigh an Ounce, when it shall be rated as Four Single Letters; and every Quarter of an Ounce above that Weight shall be charged as a Single Letter.

It is likewife enacted, that from and after the last Session of Parliament, no Letter or Packet fent by Post, within Great Britain, directed by any Member of either House of Parliament, shall be exempted from the. Duty of Poltage, unless the whole Superscription thereof shall be of the Handwriting of the Member, and shall have endorsed thereon, in the fame Hand-writing, the Name of the Member, Post Town from whence the same is to be fent, and the Day, Month, and Year, when put into the Post Office, the Day of the Month to be in Words at length; and unlefs every fuch Letter and Packet shall be put into the General, or other Post-Office, or into a Receiving House, on the Day of the Date put upon such Letter or Packet. And no Letter or Packet directed to any fuch Member shall be exempted from the Duty of Poltage, unless fuch as shall, during the Sifting of Parliament, or within Forty Days before, or Forty Days after any Summons or Prorogation thereof, be directed to any fuch Member, at the Place where he fhall actually be at the Time of the Delivery thereof, or at his usual Place of Refidence in London, or at the Houfe, or Lobby of the Houfe of Parliament, of which he is a Member.

It is further enacted, that all Perfons who, by Virtue of their Offices, fend and receive Letters and Packets free of Poltage, shall fend and receive them free, in the Manner, and under fuch Reflrictions, as any Memb r of Parliament.

It is also enacted, that if any Perion shall forge or counterfeit the Hand-writing of any Person whatfoever, in the Superfcription of any Letter or Packet, in order to avoid the Payment of Pollage, or shall server in the server

forge, counterfeit, or alter, or procure to be done, (the Date upon fuch Superscription, or. thall write, an i fend by Polt, or erails to be done, any Letter or Packet, the Superferiction or Cover whereof shall be forged or counterfeited, or the Date thereon altered, in order to avoid the Duty of Postage, knowing the fame to be forged, counterfeited, or altered, every Perfon fo offending, shall be deemed guilty of Felony,
