We entertain a pleasing Hope, that, by your Grace's Interposition and Exercions, a more equal Reprefentation of the People and fuch a Commercial Arrangement may be formed, as, by confulting the general Interefts of the Empire, may give Stability to our Manufactures, Security to our Trade, and increase cur Affection for our Sifter Kingdom.

Firmly attached to cur free and happy Conftitu-tion in Church and State, we feel the most fatisfac-tory Confidence in the Fortitude of your Grace's Character; and your Grace may depend upon our Conflicutional Support of every wife Measure which may be necessary to maintain the Authority of the Legiflature, and the Security of the Protestant Ellablifhment.

To his Grace the Duke of Rutland, Lord-Lieutenant General and General Governor of Ireland.
