Strasburg, Decemb. 10. Yeaerday the Duke of Lorrain arxived at Offenburg, where he will this day take a review f leve I Regi menes that'ire to remain in Garison there. So foon as his Highhels has given the necessary orde s for the diffoling the Troops into their feveral Winter quarvers, he will take his journy to Vienna. The Depuries of the thirteen Cantons being affembled at Bafle, have refolved to write to the Emperor and the Moft Christian King, to pray them to agree to a certain Pro-jett now framed by them for the fecurity of the four Forest Cities, Rhinfelar, Lauffenbourg, Seckingen, and Waldthut, as likewile of those of Conftance, Bregentz, and Rutolfzel; by which Project it is faid that the Moff Christian King fhall not make any attempt opon those places, provided the Imperial Garifons that are there do keep themselves Neuters, and do not

commit any hoffillity upon the French.
