*Brussels, November 8.* Accounts have been received here, that last Night the Dutch broke one of their Dikes near Lillo, by which several Persons were drowned. They attempted to break a second, but were prevented by the Imperial Troops. This Event has spread an Alarm at Ostend, and has occasioned an extraordinary Diligence in compleating the Works on the Ramparts there.

*London, November 9.*

Yesterday Richard Clark, Esq; Lord-Mayor Elect for the Year ensuing, was sworn at Guildhall; when the Chair and other Ensigns of Mayoralty were surrendered to him in the accustomed Manner.

This Day the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord-Mayor, Aldermen, and Sheriffs, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-side, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending; and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the several Companies in their respective Barges, adorned with Streamers and Pendants, to Westminster; and having walked round the Hall, and solemnly saluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchequer Bar, and the new Lord Mayor did there take the Oaths appointed; and having recorded Warrants of Attorney in the proper Courts, returned by Water to Black Fryars, and from thence in Coaches with the usual Solemnity to Guildhall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided; at which were present some of the Great Officers of State, divers of the Nobility, Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, the Judges, and many other Persons of Quality and Distinction.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third, of glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Grace attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Procession round the Statue of King William: On his Grace's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in College Green; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy.

*Dublin Castle, November 5.*

This Day being the Anniversary of the horrid Gunpowder Plot, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, drawn up in the Royal Square

Square of the Barracks; and the Evening concluded with Illuminations, Bonfires, and other Demonstrations of Joy.

**WHEREAS** it hath been humbly represented to the King, that about Four o'Clock in the Morning of the 15th Day of September last, a Ship or Vessel called the *Ebenezer*, of Pensgrund, in Norway, James Neilson, Master, laden with Deals, and bound for Bristol, struck upon the Goodwin Sands.—That the Master having made Signals of Distress, about Twenty Persons came in Boats from Ramsgate, and were employed by him in getting the Ship off the Sands, which they would in all Probability have effected, but were interrupted in and prevented from using the proper Means for that Purpose, by upwards of Two Hundred Persons, who came from Deal, and by Force and Violence boarded the said Ship, abused and ill-treated the said Master and his Crew, broke open the Ship's Hatches and Lockers, scuttled her Decks and Cabin, and plundered the said Ship of Parts of her Cargo; and in order to prevent her being got off the Sands, some of them cut away the Ship's Cable and Parts of her Shrouds, and drove out the Bolts of the Bit-Head, whereby the Windlass was so disabled that no farther Means could be used for her Preservation; and the Master and his Crew were obliged to quit their Ship, which was afterwards found afloat in the Gulf Stream.

His Majesty, for the apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the several Acts of Piracy and Felony aforesaid, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, His Majesty also is pleased to promise a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasuries, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
