The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. IS Majesty in Council was this Day pleafed to declare the Right Honorable Charles Lord Camden Lord President of His Majefty's Moft Honorable Privy Council, and his Lordship took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Great Britain, to constitute the Right Honorable Charles Earl Cornwallis Conftable of His Majefty's Tower of London, and alfo Lord Lieutenant of the Tower Hamlets, his Lordfhip this Day in Council took the Oaths appointed to be taken, inflead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy, as Constable of the faid Tower, and as Lord Lieutenant of the faid Tower Hamlets, and likewife the Oath of Constable of the Tower of London.

AS feveral Artificers and Manufasturers, Subjests of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Asts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them .- And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or inftrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Man nufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George 1. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weftminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fhall go into any Country out of His Ma-jefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador. &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfon

Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefly's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid; fuch Juffice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it fhall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences. fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Secarity, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be conviced upon Indictment of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Coart fhall think reasonable, and fhall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the fame shall be profecured in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13. F any Perfon thall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Woo!, Mnhair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch maker, or any other Artificer in any other-of the datufactures of Great Britain er Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by meistment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indistment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indicament or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County'or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cafe of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Person in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finithing of the Woollen or Silk Manufacturers or any Part of fuch Tools, he thall for every Ofthall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and thall forfeit all Lands, of Record at Weftminster, or in the Court of Sefion Seffion

Sellion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts, in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs In Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Ma-jefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on goard any Veisel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and lecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vestel, he hall for every fuch Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED BOUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Taols; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED PQUNDS, but thall also forfeit his Em-ployment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he thall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Ufe of the Perfon who shall fue for the fame.
