WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That in the Night of Friday the 22d Day of October last, Samuel Morris, Second Mate of the Affifiance Cutter, in the Service of His Majesty's Customs at Dover, commanded by Edward Columbine, being, with Seven other Mariners. in an Eight-Oared Galley belonging to the faid Cutter, on the Look out off Dungenofs Point, observed a large Lugfail Boat, at about the Distance of a Quarter of a Mile, approaching towards the Shore: That they shereupon rowed towards her, and, on coming up with her, some of the Crew in the Lugsail Boat immediately fired Two Swivel Guns, and Twenty Musquets, or thereabouts, into the said Galley, by which Richard Mackey and one other of the Crew were dangerously wounded; the first by a Musquet Ball, of which Wound he languished until the 24th Day of the said Month of October, and then died; and the other was shot through the Thigh, of which Wound he is not yet

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bring ing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually fired and killed the said Richard Mackey) who shall discover his Accomplices therein, so that Two or more of them may be a prehended and convicted
