St. James's, January 19. ESTERDAY being kept as the Anni-versary of Her Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and fplendid Appear-ance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Perfons of Diffinction, to compliment Their Majefties on the Occafion. The Guns in the Park, and at the Tower, were fired at One o'Clock. There was a Ball at Court in the Evening, and Illuminations and other Public Demonstrations of Joy in London and Westminster.

St. James's, January 22. The King has been pleafed to conflictute and ap-point Sir Charles Middleton, Bart. Edward Hunt, John Henslow, George Marsh, George Rogers, William Pahmer, William Campbell, Edward Le Cras, John Laforey, Henry Martin, Charles Proby and Henry Duncan, Efgrs. to be Principal Officers and Committeners of His Majefly's Navy.

Whiteball, January 22. The King has been pleafed to grant to Nicholas Lechmere, of Ludford, in the County of Hereford, Elq; and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to affume and take the Surname of Charlton, and to use the Arms of Charlton, (fuch Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and registered in the Heralds Office) pursuant to the last Will of his Uncle Sir Francis Charlton, late of Ludford aforefaid, Baronet, deceafed: And alfo to order, that this His Majefty's Conceffion and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

#### The humble Address of the Gentlemen, Clergy, Freemen and Freeholders of the City of Dublin, whole Names are hereunto fubfcribed.

Moft Gracious Sovereign, K, your Majefty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, humbly beg Leave to approach your Royal Perfon with the warmest Affection, Duty and Respect, and with the most fincere Professions of inviolable Attachment to your Majefty's Government, and to our happy Conflitution.

We might justly be deemed infenfible and unworthy of the Bleffings of which, through your Majefty's 1 J. Fitzgibbon

auspicious Care, through the Justice and Liberality of Great Britain, and through the wife and firm Exertions of our Legislature, we have obtained the Enjoyment, if we omitted this featonable Occasion of declaring our rooted Abhorrence of every Attempt to create unjust and dangerous Discontents, tending to fubvert the Conftitution in Church and State. We reject, with Indignation, the Interference of any Body of Men unknown to the Laws or Conflitu-tion. We rely upon the Continuance of your Ma-jefly's Paternal Regard for the Welfare of this Kingdom, feeling the warmeft and most grateful Confidence in your Majefty's late gracious Declaration, and in the Equity and Wildom of the respective Legislatures of Great Britain and Ireland, that fuch Regula-tions upon the important Objects of Trade and Com-merce will be eftablished, as shall be found best calculated to promote the Wealth and Profperity of all Parts of your Majefty's Empire. We cherifh a firm and unchangeable Attachment to the Connection with our Sifter Kingdom, as the great Band of mutual Strength and Safety. And we will fuffer no affumed Authority to dictate to the Legislature of the Land.

WHEREAS it has been humbly reprefented to the King, That, on Tuefday the 10th Day of August last, John Fisher, Commander of the Hunter Cutter, in the Service of His Majesty's Customs at the Port of Yarmonth, being on a Cruize, about Six o'Clock in the Evening, discovered a Lugger coming round Foulheli, and, subsecting her to be a Smyleler, gage Foulnefs, and, fulfecting her to be a Smugler, gave chafe, but a thick Fog coming on, loft Sight of ber for a fmall Space of Time: That being informed the faid Lugger had failed to the Southward, he manned bis Ten oar'd Boat, under the Command of Robert Tan his Second Mate outh Palak Versike and Florence ous ten our a boat, under the Command of Robert Jay, his Second Mate, with Ralph Newby and Eleven others, who, foon after Day-Light in the Morning of the 11th of August aforessaid, came up with the faid Lugger at Bacton Bay, on the Coast of Norfolk, and within the Limits of the Port of Yarmouth, and found her to be the Raston Lussen Charles Comfound ber to be the Bacton Lugger, Charles Gee, Master : That on the Officers approaching the Lugger, they were fired upon by the Smuglers on board the faid Lugger,

Two Muskets over their Heads : But that the Officers still perfisting in doing their Duty, and endeavouring to board the faid Lugger, the Firing from her was continued, and Charles Gee, the Mafter, with a Blunderbufs, pointed at the faid Robert Jay, fhot him through the Body, of which Wound he died in lefs than Half an Hour afterwards; and that at the Time the faid Charles Gee fired the Blunderbufs, the Cuftom-Houfe Boat was within Three or Four Yords of the Lugger Yards of the Lugger.
