YESTERDAY being kept as the Anniversary of Her Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties on the Occasion. The Guns in the Park, and at the Tower, were fired at One o'Clock. There was a Ball at Court in the Evening, and Illuminations and other Public Demonstrations of Joy in London and Westminster.

St. James's, January 22.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Sir Charles Middleton, Bart. Edward Hunt, John Henslow, George Marsh, George Rogers, William Palmer, William Campbell, Edward Le Cras, John Laforey, Henry Martin, Charles Proby and Henry Duncan, Esqrs. to be Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy.

Whitehall, January 22.

The King has been pleased to grant to Nicholas Lechmere, of Ludford, in the County of Hereford, Esq; and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to assume and take the Surname of Charlton, and to use the Arms of Charlton, (such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and registered in the Heralds Office) pursuant to the last Will of his Uncle Sir Francis Charlton, late of Ludford aforesaid, Baronet, deceased: And also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Whitehall, January 22.

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the Gentlemen, Clergy, Freemen and Freeholders of the City of Dublin, whose Names are hereunto subscribed.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, humbly beg Leave to approach your Royal Person with the warmest Affection, Duty and Respect, and with the most sincere Professions of inviolable Attachment to your Majesty's Government, and to our happy Constitution.

We might justly be deemed insensible and unworthy of the Blessings of which, through your Majesty's

auspicious Care, through the Justice and Liberality of Great Britain, and through the wise and firm Exertions of our Legislature, we have obtained the Enjoyment, if we omitted this seasonable Occasion of declaring our rooted Abhorrence of every Attempt to create unjust and dangerous Discontents, tending to subvert the Constitution in Church and State. We reject, with Indignation, the Interference of any Body of Men unknown to the Laws or Constitution. We rely upon the Continuance of your Majesty's Paternal Regard for the Welfare of this Kingdom, feeling the warmest and most grateful Confidence in your Majesty's late gracious Declaration, and in the Equity and Wisdom of the respective Legislatures of Great Britain and Ireland, that such Regulations upon the important Objects of Trade and Commerce will be established, as shall be found best calculated to promote the Wealth and Prosperity of all Parts of your Majesty's Empire. We cherish a firm and unchangeable Attachment to the Connection with our Sister Kingdom, as the great Band of mutual Strength and Safety. And we will suffer no assumed Authority to dictate to the Legislature of the Land.

Lugger, which was returned by the Officers firing Two Muskets over their Heads: But that the Officers still persisting in doing their Duty, and endeavouring to board the said Lugger, the Firing from her was continued, and Charles Gee, the Master, with a Blunderbuss, pointed at the said Robert Jay, shot him through the Body, of which Wound he died in less than Half an Hour afterwards; and that at the Time the said Charles Gee fired the Blunderbuss, the Custom-House Boat was within Three or Four Yards of the Lugger.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in this most atrocious Outrage and Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the said Charles Gee) who shall discover his Accomplices therein, so that Two or more of them may be apprehended and convicted of the said Offence.
