A'S feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or in-firumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Export-ation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

### Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

**I**<sup>F</sup> any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Braß, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and fhall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weftminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convict, fhall offend again, he fhall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and im-prifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-ficers, fhall go into any Country out of His Mareces, man go mio any county out of Fils Ma-jefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any luch Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador. Miniber or Could of Great Brithe Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perlon authoriled by fuch Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perlon shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, of of being an Executor of Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Use, and shall be deemed Alen, and out of His Majelly's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complaned of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions: And if fuch Perfon fhall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes of Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promile, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpose aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reafonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

#### Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon In-dictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted fliall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and thall fuffer Impri-fonment in the Common Goal of the County oz Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cafe of a subsequent Offence of
