**W**HEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Sunday the 20th Day of February last, between Six and Seven o'Clock in the Evening, some Person unknown knocked at the Door of the Dwelling-House of Mr. George Chifman, in Canterbury-square, Southwark, under Pretence of delivering a Parcel, and upon the Door being opened, Four or Five Villains rushed in, and immediately

seized the said George Chifman, bound, gagged and beat him in a very inhuman Manner, robbed him of Six Pounds, Seventeen Shillings, in Money, a plain Silver Watch, (Maker's Name Wm. Addis, London, No. 1724,) Five Silver Tea Spoons, Two Silver Table Spoons marked G. S. a Silver Pepper Box with the like Marks, Two Silver Salt Spoons, and a Pair of Silver Knee Buckles, and were proceeding to further Outrages, threatening to murder the said George Chifman, when, upon hearing a Knocking at the Door, they desisted, and made their Escape.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the daring Outrages and Robbery abovementioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplices therein, so that they, or either of them, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
