fudrat she Court at Vienne, that they are going to choose them a King, and give out that they expect an afliftance of 15000 Poles more.

Ratiebonne, Decemb. 23. The Suiffe Cantons, upon the preffing inflance of the Miniflers of the Emperor, and the King of Spain, have taken under their protection the four Forest Cities; and belides have declared, that they will affill the Crown of Spain with fuchTroops as thall be necessary for the prefervation of Flauders, The Count de Sternberg, Vicechancellor of Behemia, is in few dayes expected at the Court of the Elector of Bavaria, being charged with a Commillion from the Emperor. The Duke of Lorrain is expected at Vienna yet before Christmas, and his marriage with the Emperor's Sister will be Celebrated the 25th of the next month; in his absence Prince Herman of Baden will have the command of the Army. From Caffaw in Hungary we have advice, that the Rebels had attacked a firong Post called Breffermin, and that they had been repulled in three Affaults they made.

Strasburgh, Decemb. 24. The apprehensions and fears of People, that they shall be attack by the French is very great, but what ground they have for them befides their own distrusts we cannot learn. The French are laying a Bridge over the Rhine at Blosheym, in order to their attacking, as is faid, Offenburg and Stelhoffen. Major General Vermuller, who was appointed by the Duke of Lerrain in the first place, is faid to be dead. The States of the Lower Alface are summoned to repair to Brifis, to agree with the Intendant there about their Contributions.

Cologne, Decemb. 28. The Sieur de Landfer, the Imperial Ambaflador, continues still here, and preferour Magistrates to raife the 40000 Crowns demanded by the Imperial Commission for the freeing them from Wintenquarters, to which they have not been as yet able to wonfent. The French found a very great quankity of Corn and Ammunition in Sarbruck 3 they have on y put 25 men into the place, and are returned to M.tz. The Count de Caprara remains with the Troops under his command in the Neighborhood of Demapones, finding himfelf mot strong enough to make head against the French Troops, commanded by the Marquis de Rannes, on the Saar. The Elector of Treves has seinforced the Garifon of that City, upon the apprehension he has that the French will attack it at the opening of the Campagnes.

opening of the Campagne. Hague, Decemb. 28. The 24th his Highnels went hence to his houle at Soeffdike, with intention to pals fome dayes there in Hunting. The Deputies from Grewingen, as likewife those from the Ommelanden, are now in Town; it is believed the matters in difference between them will be finally compoled in a flort time, the States very much concerning themfelves therein. Count Weldecke is gone to his houle at Caylenburg, where he will make but a flort flay, and return to his quarter at Malines. My Lord Ambaffador Hide, who arrived here fome dayes fince from Nimeguen, to perform his Compliment to their Highneffes, is returning thither.

Amflerdam, Decemb, 31. The News we have this afternoon by our Letters from Hamburgh of the Oapitulation of Stetin, is at prefent the fole entertainment of ehis palce; it is lookt upon as a ching of very great importance, and which in all likelihood will produce a great change of affaits in those parts. It is believed the for of this place will have a great influence upon Stratel, fond, which is the only place of confideration that aremains to the Suedes in Pomeren, From Flanders we have an account, that the Spaniards are kept in continual Alarm with the motions of the French, who dra their Troops together in different places, and feem t have fome great defigit in hand; every body thind Mons or Namur will be befieged before the end of the next month, and that the French King will be in the Field in perfon by the middle of the month. In thef, Countries the preparations for the Campagne are haftening with all the diligence poffible; and it is faid t! Prince of Orange purpofes to be in the Field by the beginning of February.

Bruffels, Decemb. 31. The motions of the French Troops do Very much alarm us, and give us ground to believe their defign to be upon Mons or Namur, or upon both. His Excellency the Duke de Villa Hermofs fene the laft Night Count Horne with his Regiment to Mons, and at the fame time ordered another Dusch Regiment to march to Namur, to reinforce that Garilon. And this morning the Prince of Vaudemons is gone hence with 200 Horfe, to put himfelf into Mons, to be prefent with the Duke d'Aerfchos his Unkle, in cafe of a Siege. From Merg they write, that the French having taken the feveral places poffeffed by the Imperiakifs on the Sasr, are gone into their quarters, with Orders to be ready to march again by the 6th of Febwarsy.

Antwerp, Jan. 1. We hear from all fides of the preparations of the French for an early Campagne, their Troops begin to march already, and we are in expectation to hear very fhortly that they are drawn into # Body, in order to the attacking fome place, as Moss or Namur. The Prince de Vaudemont, we hear, har put binfelf into the former, the Duke d'Aerfabot, the Governor of that City and Province, being his Unkle. The Lotters from Hamburg juft now arrived, bring an account that Sterin had finally Capiculated.

Earis. Fan. 1. The Duke de Vivonne, Viceroy of Sicil, having defired leave to return home, which the King has grant of him, and at the fame time has appointed the Duke de la Feail/ade to fuceed him in that Government ; and accordingly he will part hence in two or three dayes for Thoulon, where he will embark on the fhips selfigned with a fupply of Men and Froyifions for Medina. The King has likewile nominated the Sieur d. Guillerogues to go to Confiantimople, in quality of his Ambaffador.
