WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That a Written Paper, purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of the late Lieutenant-General Jordan Wren, deceased, bearing Date the 29th Day of October, 1783, signed with his Name, and with the Names of Edward Bayleys and Samuel Head as Witnesses, was found in the Area of General Robinson's House in Great Marlborough-street, on the 29th of March last, between the Hours of Eight and Nine o'Clock in the Evening, where it had been thrown by by some Person or Persons unknown, and that there is great Reason to believe that the said Will is in every Respect a Forgery, the pretended Witnesses thereto never having appeared to prove the same:

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in forging the said Will, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the Name of the said Lieutenant-General Jordan Wren thereto) who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Forgery, so that he, she or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

The other Person is about Thirty-six Years of Age, Five Feet Six or Seven Inches high, thin made, his Face red, wears his own Hair, and is supposed to be dressed in a dark-coloured Coat. They had both the Appearance of Farmers, and were seen in London the Evening of the Robbery.
