**T**HE King has been pleased to grant to Thomas Woodrouffe, of Great St. Helen's in the City of London, Merchant, and his Issue (pursuant to the last Will of John William Smith, his late Partner, deceased) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname of Smith, in Addition to that of Woodrouffe; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession be registered in His College of Arms.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for further continuing, for a limited Time, an Act made in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for preventing certain Instruments from being required from Ships belonging to the United States of America, and to give to His Majesty, for a limited Time, certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the said United States," and for continuing, for a limited Time, an Act made in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act to extend the Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty, for giving His Majesty certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of His Majesty's Dominions, and the Inhabitants of the United States of America, to the Trade and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British Colonies and Plantations in America, with Respect to certain Articles therein mentioned," it is enacted, that the said Acts, and all the Matters and Things therein contained, shall continue and be in force until the 5th Day of April, 1786; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that any unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law, (except Oil) and any Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Indico, Malts, Yards and Bowsprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British or American Ships, by British Subjects, or by any of the People inhabiting in, and belonging to, the said United States, or any of them, and may be entered and landed in any Port in this Kingdom, upon Payment of the same Duties as the like Sort of Goods or

Merchandize are or may be subject and liable to, if imported by British Subjects, in British Ships, from any British Island or Plantation in America, and no other, notwithstanding such Goods or Merchandize, or the Ships in which the same may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law:—

And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be the same Drawbacks, Exemptions and Bounties on Merchandizes and Goods exported from Great Britain, into the Territories of the said United States of America, or any of them, as are or may be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America; and that (until further Order) there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks on the Exportation of any Sort of Foreign Hemp, or Foreign Iron exported from Great Britain into any British Colony or Plantation in America, or into the Territories of the United States of America, or any of them, as are or may be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of Hemp or Iron, and under the same Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures in all Respects, as such Drawbacks are allowed and paid, or are subject and liable to by Law, upon the Exportation of such Hemp and Iron into other Foreign Parts.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the said United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence, in Manner abovementioned, and may be landed in this Kingdom; and, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty commonly called the Old Subsidy (except as hereinafter excepted) such Tobacco may be warehoused under His Majesty's Locks, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of all the farther Duties due for such Tobacco, within the Time limited by Law, according to the net Weight and Quantity of such Tobacco, at the Time it shall be so landed, with the same Allowances for the Payment of such farther Duties, and under the like Restrictions and Regulations in all other Respects, not altered by this Order, as such Tobacco is and may be warehoused by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parliament in Force: But it is His Majesty's Pleasure nevertheless, that upon the Importation of any such Tobacco into the Ports of London, Bristol, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glasgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the Duty commonly called the Old Subsidy, as of all the

the farther Duties due for such Tobacco, but without any Allowance for prompt Payment of the said Duty, commonly called the Old Subsidy, or any other of the Duties which were formerly payable in ready Money; and that if any Tobacco, which has been or shall be so imported, during the Continuance of this Order, from the Territories of the said United States, into the said Ports of London, Bristol, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glasgow, shall be afterwards taken, within the Time limited, out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be secured under His Majesty's Locks, in Manner herein before directed, at either of the above-mentioned Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which have been or shall be entered into for Payment of the said Duties, shall be discharged in the Manner directed by the several Acts of Parliament now in Force.

And, for the Purpose of regulating the Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in the West Indies, including in that Description the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somers Islands, and the People and Territories belonging to the said United States of America, His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that no Goods or Commodities whatsoever, except Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Hemp and Flax, Masts, Yards and Bowsprits, Staves, Heading, Boards, Timber, Shingles, and all other Species of Lumber; Horses, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions; Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain, being the Growth or Production of any of the said United States of America, shall be imported from any of the said United States of America, into any of His Majesty's West India Islands, the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somers Islands; and that such Goods may, until further Order, be imported by British Subjects only, and in no other than British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; and that Rum, Sugar, Melasses, Coffee, Cocoa-Nuts, Ginger and Pimento, may (until further Order) be exported by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the said Islands to any Port or Place within the said United States, upon Payment of the same Duties on Exportation, and subject to the like Rules, Regulations, Securities and Restrictions, as the same Articles by Law are or may be subject and liable to, if exported to any British Colony or Plantation in America; and the Bonds and Securities heretofore required to be taken for such Ships carrying such Goods, shall and may be cancelled and discharged, upon the like Certificates as are required by the said recited Act made in the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to discharge any Bonds given in Great Britain for the due Landing any other Goods in the said United States of America.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that no Goods or Commodities, being the Growth or Manufacture of the said United States, shall be imported into the Provinces of Nova-Scotia, or New Brunswick, and their respective Dependencies, except Horses, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions; Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Biscuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain; also Lumber of every Sort; and that the above Articles shall be imported by British Subjects only, and in none other than British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and during such limited Times only as the Governors or Com-

manders in Chief for the Time being of the said Provinces, and their respective Dependencies, shall with the Advice of their respective Councils, by Proclamation, declare the Importation of any of the said Articles to be necessary for the Supply of the Inhabitants of the said Provinces.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that no Goods or Commodities of the Growth or Manufacture of the said United States shall be imported into any of the Ports of the Province of Québec.—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury; and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

Lisbon, March 26.

The Treaty for the Marriage between the Infanta of Portugal and the Infant Don Gabriel of Spain is signed.

Madrid, March 29.

On Easter Sunday, the 27th Instant, the Portuguese Ambassador at this Court made his Public Entry into Madrid, and, in a formal Audience of the King of Spain, demanded the Infanta Donna Charlotta (Eldest Daughter of the Prince of Asturias) in Marriage for the Infant Don Juan of Portugal. In the Evening the Contract was read and signed in the Presence of the Royal Family, the Grandees of Spain, and the Great Officers of State. After which the Marriage Ceremony was performed by the Patriarch of the Indies, His Catholick Majesty standing Proxy for the Infant Don Juan.

Vienna, March 30.

Prince Joseph Lobkowitz is appointed Captain of the Noble German Guard, vacant by the Death of the late Marshal Colloredo; Lieutenant-General Nostitz is raised to the Rank of General of Cavalry, and is made Captain of the Guard (called *les Archers*) formerly commanded by Marshal Thierheim; and General Clairfait is appointed Vice Commandant of the City of Vienna, in the Room of General Nostitz.
