The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act paffed in this prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act " for further continuing, for a limited Time, an "At made in the Twenty-third Year of the "Reign of His prefent Majefly, initialed, An "Actign of Fils present majony, minutes, Jan "Act for preventing certain Infiruments from be-"ing required from Ships belonging to the United "States of America, and to give to His Majefty, "for a limited Time, certain Powers for the better "carrying on Trade and Conimerce between the "Subisfue of His Majefue Dominions and the In-" Subjects of His Majefty's Dominions and the In-"habitants of the faid United States," and for con-tinuing, for a limited Time, an Act made in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majelty, initialed, "An Act to extend the "Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third "Years of His prefere His Majelty and the History History History" " Year of His prefent Majesty, for giving His Ma-" jefty certain Powers for the better carrying on " Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of " His Majesty's Dominions, and the Inhabitants " of the United States of America, to the Trade " and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British ⁴⁶ Colonies and Plantations in America, with Re-⁴⁶ spect to certain Articles therein mentioned," it is enacted, that the faid Acts, and all the Matters and Things therein contained, fhall continue and be in force until the 5th Day of April, 1786; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that any unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation or which into this Kingdom is not prohi-bited by Law, (except Oil) and any Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Indico, Maîts, Yards and Bowíprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British or American Ships, by British Subjects, or by any of the People inhabiting in, and belonging to, the faid United States, or any of them, and may be entered and landed in any Port in this Kingdom, upon Payment of the fame Duties as the like Sort of Goods or

Merchandize are or may be subject and liable to, if imported by British Subjects, in British Ships, from any British Island or Plantation in America, and no other, notwithstanding fuch Goods or Mer-chandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law :-

And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be the fame Drawbacks, Exemptions and Bounties on Merchandizes and Goods exported from Great Britain, into the Territories of the faid United States of America, or any of them, as are or may be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands Plan-tations, or Colonies, belonging to the 4 rown of Great Britain in America; and that (until further Order) there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks on the Exportation of any Sott of Foreign Hemp, or Foreign Iron exported from Great Britain into any British Colony or Planation in America, or into the Territories of the United States of America, or any of them, as are or may be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of Hemp or Iron, and under the fame Rules, Regulations, Reflrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures in all Respects, as such Drawbacks are allowed and paid, or are fubject and liable to by Law, upon the Exportation of fuch Hemp and Iron into other Foreign Parts.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleafed to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence, in Manner abovementioned, and may be landed in this Kingdom; and, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy (except as hereinafter excepted) fuch Tobacco may be warehoused under His Majefty's Locks, upon the Im-porter's own Bond for Payment of all the farther Duties due for such Tobacco, within the Time limited by Law, according to the net Weight and Quantity of such Tobacco, at the Time it shall be fo landed, with the fame Allowances for the Payment of fuch farther Duties, and under the like Restrictions and Regulations in all other Respects, not altered by this Order, as fuch Tobacco is and may be warehoused by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parliament in Force: But it is His Majetty's Pleafure neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Tobacco into the Ports of London, Brittol, Portf. mouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all

the farther Daties due for fuch Tobacco, but without any Allowance for prompt Payment of the faid Duty, commonly called the Old Sublidy, or any other of the Duties which were formerly payable in ready Money; and that if any Tobacco, which has been or shall be so imported, during the Con-tinuance of this Order, from the Territories of the faid United States, into the faid Ports of London, Briftol, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, shall be afterwards taken, within the Time limited, out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be secured under His Majesty's Locks, in Manner herein before directed, at either of the above-mentioned Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which have been or shall be entered into for Payment of the faid Duties, shall be discharged in the Manner directed by the several Acts of Parliament now in Force.

And, for the Purpose of regulating the Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in the Weft Belonging to the Clown of Oren articles, including in that Defcription the Bahama Iflands, and the Bermuda or Somers Iflands, and the People and Territories belonging to the faid United States of America, His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that no Goods or Com-modities whatfoever, except Pitch, Tar, Turpen-tine, Hemp and Flax, Mails, Yards and Bowfprits, Staves, Heading, Boards, Timber, Shingles, and all other Species of Lumber; Horfes, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions; Peale, Beans, Po-tatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain, being the Growth or Production of any of the faid United States of America, shall be imported from any of the faid United States of America, into any of His Majefty's West India Islands, the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somers Islands; and that fuch Goods may, until further Order, be imported by British Subjects only, and in no other than British built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; and that Rum, Sugar, Melasses, Coffee, Cocoa-Nuts, Ginger and Pimento, may (until further Order) be exported by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned by His Ma-jesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the faid Islands to any Port or Place within the faid United States, upon Payment of the fame Duties on Exportation, and subject to the like Rules, Regulations, Securities and Reffrictions, as the fame Articles by Law are or may be subject and liable to, if exported to any British Colony or Plantation in America; and the Bonds and Securities heretofore required to be taken for fuch Ships carrying fuch Goods, shall and may be cancelled and discharged, upon the like Certificates as are required by the faid recited Act made in the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, to discharge any Bonds given in Great Britain for the due Land-ing any other Goods in the faid United States of America.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that no Goods or Commodities, being the Growth or Manufacture of the faid United States, fhall be imported into the Provinces of Nova-Scotia, or New Brunfwick, and their respective Dependencies, except Horles, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions; Peafe, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain; alfo Lumber of every Sort; and that the above Articles shall be imported by British Subjects only, and in none other than Bri-tish-built Ships, owned by His Majest,'s Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and during fuch limited Times only as the Governors or Com-

manders in Chief for the Time being of the faid Provinces, and their respective Dependencies, shall with the Advice of their respective Councils, by Proclamation, declare the Importation of any of the faid Articles to be necessary for the Supply of the Inhabitants of the faid Provinces.

And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, that no Goods or Commodities of the Growth or Manufacture of the faid United States shall be imported into any of the Ports of the Province of Quebec .- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury; and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. Lifbon, March 26.

The Treaty for the Marriage between the Infanta of Portugal and the Infant Don Gabriel of Spain is figned.

Madrid, March 29.

On Easter Sunday, the 27th Instant, the Portuguese Ambassador at this Court made his Public Entry into Madrid, and, in a formal Audience of the King of Spain, demanded the Infanta Donna Charlotta (Eldeft Daughter of the Prince of Afturias) in Mar-riage for the Infant Don Juan of Portugal. In the Evening the Contract was read and figned in the Prefence of the Royal Family, the Grandees of Spain, and the Great Officers of State. After which the Marriage Ceremony was performed by the Patriarch of the Indies, His Catholick Majesty standing Proxy for the Infant Don Juan.

Vienna, March 30.

Prince Joseph Lobkowitz is appointed Captain of the Noble German Guard, vacant by the Death of the late Marthal Colloredo; Lieutenant-General Noflitz is raifed to the Rank of General of Cavalry, and is made Captain of the Guard (called *les Archers*) formerly commanded by Marshal Thierheim; and General Clairfait is appointed Vice Commandant of the City of Vienna, in the Room of General Noftitz.
