This Day his Grace the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, with the usual Solemnity, and the Commons being sent for, gave the Royal Assent to

An Act for further continuing an Act, intituled, An Act for facilitating the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the United States of America, and for furthering the said Trade and Intercourse, and for prohibiting the Import of Tobacco not being of the Growth of the said States, or of the British Plantations, or Great Britain.

An Act for granting the Sum of Twenty Thousand Pounds to the Speaker of the House of Commons, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, the Deputy Vice-Treasurer, the Teller of the Exchequer, the Senior Commissioner of His Majesty's Revenue, the Right Honourable Thomas Conolly, and the Right Honourable Luke Gardiner, or any Four of them, for the Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act for the better Encouragement of Trade by regulating the Payment of Bounties, and exempting them from Fees. And to

An Act to prevent the Practice of seducing Artificers and Manufacturers out of this Kingdom, and of exporting the several Tools and Utensils made Use of in preparing and working up the Manufactures thereof, into Parts beyond the Seas.

The other Person is about Thirty-six Years of Age, Five Feet Six or Seven Inches high, thin made, his Face red, wears his own Hair, and is supposed to be dressed in a dark-coloured Coat. They had both the Appearance of Farmers, and were seen in London the Evening of the Robbery.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, both or either of the Persons who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Reward of **TWO HUNDRED POUNDS**, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Persons whether an Accomplice in the said Robbery or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery whereby both or either of the Persons who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of both or either of the Parties, be entitled to the same Reward of **TWO HUNDRED POUNDS**, and will also receive His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.
