The other Perſon is about Thirty-fix Years of Age, Five Feet Six or Seven Inches high, thin made, his Face red, wears his own Hair, and is ſuppoſed to be dreſſed in a dark-coloured Coat. They had both the Appearance of Farmers, and were ſeen in London the Evening of the Robbery.
