A S feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

I any Perfon fhall contract with, entice, or foligit; any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and fhall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Weftminfter, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he fhall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and fhall be imprifoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convict, fhall offend again, he fhall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, fhall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercife or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, fhall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minifter or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers fhall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfon fhall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devife or Purchafe; and fhall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ufe, and fhall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complaned of before him, or before fome other Juffice ; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.
