#### St. James's, June 9.

HIS Day John Adams, Esq; Minister Plenipotentiary from the United States of America, had a Private Audience of Her Majesty.

To which he was introduced by the Earl of Ailes-bury, Lord Chamberlain to Her Majesty, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Mafter of the Ceremonies.

#### Whitehall, June 11.

The King has been pleafed to conftitute and appoint the Right Honourable Francis Baron Olborne (commonly called Marquis of Carmarthen) to be Governor of the Islands of Scilly, alias Sully, alias Sorlingues, in the Room of the Right Honourable Francis Lord Godolphin, deceased.

#### Lifbon, May 21.

The Spanish Infanta Dona Carlota Joacquina arrived at Villa Vicofa the 8th Inftant, and in the Afternoon of the fame Day the Ceremony of the Exchange of the new-married Princeffes took Place. On the 12th in the Afternoon the Portuguese In-fanta Dona Marianna Victoria set out from Villa Vicosa on her Journey to Spain.

#### Aranjuez, May 26.

The Infanta Dona Marianna Victoria, of Portugal, arrived here on Monday laft.

#### St. James's, August 28.

A S feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent such Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalities they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that Difference to them.—And it could be objected, that they extend to thole who are any ways concerned or in-firumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Ma-nufacturers out of thele Kingdoms, and in the Export-ation of the Tools and Infruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

#### Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Person shall contract with, entice, or solicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign

Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and Ihall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weffminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-fon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difference of the Court and imstiall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and im-prisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Ma-jesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfon shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any an Executor or Auministrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and fhall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom; to His Majefty' Ufe, and fhall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes aforefaid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Person complaned of before him, or before some other Justice; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seftions : And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Juffice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he fhall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reafonable, and fhall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the same shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

#### Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

**TF** any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within, the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Impri-fonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cafe of a subsequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland fhall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finifhing of the Woollen or Silk Manufacturers or any Part of fuch Tools, he fhall for every Offence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weftminfter, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts, in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It fhall be lawful for any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer fhall find on Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized fhall, after Condemnation, be pubhicklyl old to the beft Bidder ; and one Moiety of the Produce fhall be to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who fhall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he fhall for every fuch Offence forfeit. ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but fhall alfo forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.
