IRISH STATE LOTTERY.

Stamp-Office, London, June 13, 1785.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, that by the Act made in the 22d Year of His present Majesty for licensing Lottery-Office Keepers, and regulating the Sale of Lottery Tickets, after reciting, that it was become a common Practice in London and other Places in Great Britain to have Offices for selling Tickets in Lotteries established in Ireland by Irish Acts of Parliament; and also reciting, that it was thought expedient to allow of the selling such Irish Tickets within Great Britain, on the Terms of having the Sale of them under the same Regulations as are appointed for Tickets in Lotteries established by British Acts of Parliament: It is enacted, that it should be lawful to buy and sell, within all Parts of Great Britain (except the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge) any Ticket or Tickets in any Lottery or Lotteries now authorized or hereafter to be authorized by any Irish Act of Parliament, or any Share or Shares of any Ticket or Tickets in any such Irish Lottery or Lotteries, in the same Manner as if such Irish Tickets were Tickets in a Lottery established by an Act of Parliament of Great Britain: The Commissioners think it expedient therefore to give this Publick Notice, that the several Powers and Regulations provided by the said Act, with respect to all Dealings of the English Lottery, either as to the being duly licensed, or the Selling of Tickets or Shares of Tickets therein, are equally applicable and in Force, as to the Sale of Irish Tickets or Shares thereof in Great Britain; and that all Persons offending against the said Act in any wise, by selling of Chances or Policies under any Pretence or Device whatsoever, will be prosecuted.
