**H**IS Majesty's Commissioners for Licensing Hawkers, Pedlars, Petty Chapmen, &c. do hereby give Notice, That by virtue of an Act of Parliament passed this present Session, the following Duties, (clear of any Discount or Allowance whatever) are annually made payable from the 1st Day of August, 1785: And that Licences, agreeable to the Directions of the said Act, and according to the Regulations and true Intent and Meaning of the Laws in Force respecting Hawkers, Pedlars, Petty Chapmen, &c. will be ready to be delivered on Wednesday next, the 10th Instant, at their Office in Somerset Place in the Strand, viz.

- For every Annual Licence to be granted to an Hawker, Pedlar, &c. travelling on Foot, the clear Sum of - - - - - £ 8
- For every Annual Licence to be granted to an Hawker, Pedlar, &c. travelling with one Horse, Afs or Mule, or other Beast bearing or drawing Burthen, the clear Sum of - - - - - £ 16
- And in like Manner an additional Duty of 8l. on every Licence to be granted for every additional Horse, Afs or Mule, or other Beast bearing or drawing Burthen.

By the said Act of Parliament passed this Session the following Penalties are directed to be paid, viz.

- That every Hawker who shall refuse to produce his or her Licence to any Surveyor or other authorized Person, to forfeit - - - - - £ 10
- That every Hawker found trading or travelling without a Licence to forfeit - - - - - £ 10
- That every Hawker travelling with a borrowed Licence to forfeit - - - - - £ 10
- That every Hawker lending his Licence to forfeit - - - - - £ 10
- That every Hawker travelling with a forged or counterfeited Licence to forfeit - - - - - £ 100
- That from and after the 24th of June, 1786, every Hawker who shall open a Room or Shop to expose Goods to sale by Auction without a Licence to forfeit - - - - - £ 50
- That from and after the said 24th of June, 1786, every Hawker who shall open a Room or Shop in any City, Market Town or Place, or within Two Miles thereof (except on a Market or Fair Day) for each and every Offence to forfeit £ 10
