THEIR Sicilian Majesties arrived here this Evening from Genoa on board the Saint Joachimo Line of Battle Ship, accompanied by the Neapolitan Fleet, with His Britannick Majesty's Frigates the Thetis and Orpheus, and a Dutch Frigate and Cutter. Their Majesties landed privately after Sun-set, went to the French Comedy, and the same Evening set out for Florence.
