ESTERDAY Morning, about Ten o'Clock, Their Majesties, accompanied by Six of the Princes and Princesses, arrived in this City, and alighting at Christ Church College attended Divine Service at the Chapel; after which They viewed the Library, the Hall, and every other Part worthy of Notice in that College. Their Majesties and their Royal Highnesses then proceeded to Merton's, New College, All-Souls, St. John's, Queen's, and Magdalen's, and visited also the principal Public Buildings. On Their Arrival at the Sheldonian Theatre, They were received by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Process, Heads of Houses, Professors, and other Members of this University, in their goodemical Habits, who had the Honour of in their academical Habits, who had the Honour of kissing Their Majesties Hands. At Four o'Clock Their Majesties went to the Town Hall, where the Mayor and several Members of this Corporation attended, and had likewise the Honour to kis Their Majesties Hands, when the King was pleased to confer the Honour of Knighthood on John Treacher, Esq; Mayor.

Their Majesties and Their Royal Highnesses set out from hence at Half an Hour past Five in the Afternoon, amidst the Acclamations of a great Concourse of People; and in the Evening the City was illuminated, and fuch other Demonstrations of Joy were manifested as were suitable to the Occasion.
