The Letters are intended to be sent out regularly from hence between the Hours of Nine and Ten in the Morning, so as to reach the most distant Parts of the Town by Twelve at Noon.

It is necessary that all Newspapers should be put into this Office before Six o'Clock, otherwise they cannot be certain of an immediate Conveyance.

N. B. Some Resolutions having been entered into at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace held at Swansea, by the Justices and other Gentlemen assembled, for altering, repairing and perfecting the Roads for the Accommodation of the Mail in every Manner in their Power; and as farther Regulations and Arrangements are intended to take Place in the Post for that Part of the Kingdom in consequence of the same, the Departure

of the Mail Coaches for South-Wales is necessarily deferred a short Time longer.

\* \* The Angel behind St. Clement's Church, and the Gloucester Coffee-house, Piccadilly, are the Places from whence the Mail Coaches will go to all Parts of South Wales, both by Way of Newnham, Cardiff and Swansea; and also by Way of Ross, Hereford, Brecknock, Carmarthen, &c. to Haverfordwest and Milford Haven.

The Mail Coach to Dover will start next Monday, from the Gloucester Coffee-house, Piccadilly, and the George and Blue Boar, Holborn.

General Post-Office February 25, 1785.

THE Post-Boy bringing the Mail to this Office from Kingston was stopped near to the Bald Faced Stag Alehouse adjoining to Wimbledon Common, between Four and Five o'Clock this Morning, by Two Men on Foot, who broke open the Cart, and took away the Mail containing the following Bags, viz.

One of the Persons who committed this Robbery is described to be about Fifty Years of Age, Five Feet Nine or Ten Inches high, lusty made, his Hair grey, which he wears hanging upon his Shoulders, smooth Face, and is supposed to be dressed in a blue Surcoat Coat.

The other Person is about Thirty-six Years of Age, Five Feet Six or Seven Inches high, thin made, his Face red, wears his own Hair, and is supposed to be dressed in a dark-coloured Coat. They had both the Appearance of Farmers, and were seen in London the Evening of the Robbery.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, both or either of the Persons who committed this Robbery, will be entitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen; or if any Persons whether an Accomplice in the said Robbery or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery whereby both or either of the Persons who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of both or either of the Parties, be entitled to the same Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, and will also receive His Majesty's most Gracious Pardon.
