## CLARK, Mayor.

R ULES, ORDERS and ORDINANCES, to commence and take Place from the First Day of November, 1785, made, framed, and fet down in Writing; by the Court of the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of London, the Fourth Day of October, 1785, for the governing and regulating all Persons who shall fish or drudge in the River of Thames, and also in the Waters of Medway, within the Jurisdiction of the Lord Mayor of the said City of London, as Conservator of the said River of Thames and Waters of Medway, as common Fishermen or Drudgermen, or otherwise, and for Declaration in what Manner they shall demean themselves in Fishing, and with what Manner of Nets and Engines, and at what Times and Seasons they shall use Fishing in the faid River and Waters of Medway, within the Jurisdiction aforesaid; and for ascertaining the Assize of the several Fish to be there taken, and for the Preservation, from Time to Time, of the Spawn and Fry of Fish, in the said River and Waters, within the Jurisdiction aforesaid; and for obliging every common Fisherman, Drudgerman, or other Person who shall sish with a Boat, Vessel, or Crast, from and after the said First Day of November, 1785, in the faid River of Thames, or in the faid Waters of Medway, within the Jurisdiction aforesaid, to have in his Boat, Vessel, or Graft, both his Christian and Surname, and also the Name of the Parish or Place in which he dwelieth, painted in legible and large Characters, in some convenient Place, where any one may fee and read the fame, and for preventing fuch Name or Mark of Distinction from being changed, altered, or defaced, with reasonable Penalties annexed for Breach of fuch Rules, Orders, or Ordinances, in purfuance of the Act of Parliament made and pasted in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of His late Majeffy King George the Second, intituled, " An Act " for the more effectual Preservation and Improve-" ment of the Spawn and Fry of Fish in the River of Thames, and Waters of Medway, and for the better regulating the Fishery thereof."

Imprimis, THAT all unlawful Nets and Engines, and other Abuses offered to the Prejudice and Destruction of the Fishery, may be discovered, It is ordained by the faid Court, That no Persons shall stall the Tide of Flood, and that no Person shall fish, or endeavour to take Fistr, in the said River of Thames, between London Bridge and Richmond Bridge, with any Sort of Net other than and except

For Salmon, with a Net of not less than Six Inches

in the Mesh.

For Pike, Jack, Pearch, Roach, Chub, and Barbel, with a Flew or Stream-Net of not less than Three Inches in the Mesh throughout, with a Facing of Seven Inches, and not more than Sixteen Fathom long.

For Shads, with a Net of not less than Two Inches

and a Half in the Mesh.

For Flunders, with a Net of not less than Two Inches and a Half in the Mesh, and not more than

Sixteen Fathom long,

For Dace, with a single Blay Net of not less than Two Inches in the Mesh, and not more than Thirteen Fathom long, to be worked by Fleeting only, with a Boat and a Buoy.

For Smelts, with a Net of not less than One Inch and Quarter in the Melh, and not of greater Length than Sixteen Fathom, to be worked by Fleeting only, with a Boat and a Buoy, under the Penalty of forfeiting and paying the Sum of Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

2. Item, That no Person shall lie or bend over any Net whatfoever during the Time of Flood, whereby any Kind of Fish may be hindered or kept back from swimming upwards, to the Benefit and Profit of such Fishermen as dwell above London Bridge, in the West Part of the faid River, under Penalty of forfeiting and paying Five Pounds for every such Offence.

3. Item, That no Perion shall shoot or place any Draw-Net, Cod-Net, or other Net or Engine, in the faid River Thames, to catch Salmon with, or shall use any Net or Device to catch Salmon in the said River of Thames, except only with a Net of full Six Inches in the Meth; and that no Person shall wilfully do or commit, or cause to be done or committed, any Act whattoever in the faid River Thames; whereby any Spawn or imall Fry of Salmon thall be taken, killed, or destroyed, or whereby any Salmon shall be hindred from passing or going up the said River Thames to spawn, upon the Penalty of sorfeit. ing Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

4. Item, That no Perion, between the 10th Day of September and the 25th Day of January, in every Year, shall fish in the said River of Thames, or Waters of Medway, for Salmon, with any Net or Nets, Engine or Device, or within that Time, take, kill, or destroy, in the said River or Waters of Med-way, Salmon of any Kind or Sort whatsoever; or sell; or offer to or for Sale, Salmon of any Kind or Sort whatfoever, taken in the faid River of Thames, or Waters of Medway, under the Penalty of forfeiting

and paying Five Pounds for every such Offence.

51 Item; That no Person shall fish with any Net, or lay or haul any Weel; or lay or use any Net, Engine, or Device whatsoever, to take Fish in the faid River of Thames, or Waters of Medway, from Sun-fetting on Saturday Night, until Sun-rifing on Monday Morning, at any Time of the Year, upon the Penalty of forfeiting and paying Forty Shil-

lings for every fuch Offence.

6. Item, That no Person shall, at any Time, ship their Draw-Nets, called shipping a-stern, into their Boats, before fuch Time as they have laid forth all their whole Net, as they do when they land towards a low Water; nor shall they ship some Part of their faid Net, and land the rest, under the Penalty of forfeiting and paying Five Pounds for every such Offence.

7. Item, That no Person shall use any Spear, called an Eel-Spear, or use or work on the River Thames, or Waters of Medway, at any Time of the Year, any Blay-Net for catching any Kind of Fifth, either Ebb or by Flood, which hath any Mesh of less Size than Tous Inches at least, and of no greater Length. than Thirteen Fathom; and that no Blay-Net shall be worked or used on the said River Thames, or Waters of Medway, at any other Time of the Year than between the First Day of July and the First Day of March in every Year; and that no Person shall sheet with any Blay-Net, not being of the Breadth in the Mesh hereby directed; but that no such Blay-Net shall, at any Time of the Year, be brought or used Westward of Richmond Bridge on the said River, under the Penalty of forfeiting and paying for every fuch Offence the Sum of Five Pounds.

8. Item, That no Person shall, after the First Day of November, 1785, carry or use any Smelt-Net on the said River of Fhames, other than and except Westward of Purfleet, with a Fleeting-Net of not less than One Inch and a Quarter in the Mesh, and of no greater Length than Sixteen Fathom, between the Twenty-fifth Day of March and the First Day of May, and Eastward of Pursleet, with a Drag-Net of not less than One Inch and a Quarter in the Mesh, to be wed only between the First Day of November and the Twenty-fifth Day of March, and, after the faid Twenty-fifth Day of March, the Drag-Nets to be delivered into the Custody of the Water Bailist for the Time being, under the Penalty of Five Pounds.

9. Item, That no Person shall have or use, within the Jurisdiction aforesaid, any Double-walled Net for catching any Sort of Fish, nor any Flew or Stream Net for catching any Sort of Fish between London and Richmond Bridges, which shall have any Mesh of less Size than Three Inches at least (except a Shad-Not of Two Inches and a Half in the Mesh; a

Flounder-

Flounder-Net of Two Inches and a Half in the Mesh; a Dace Electing-Net of Two Inches in the Mesh; and a Smelt Fleeting-Net of One Inch and a Quarter in the Mesh; which said several Nets are to be worked only in their respective Seasons and Places;) nor any Sort of Net for catching Fish Eastward of London Bridge, of less Size than Two Inches and Three Quarters in the Mesh (except Smelt Drags to be worked only Eastward of Pursteet, and Smelt Fleeting Nets Westward of Pursteet, and in their Seasons) and that no Person shall have, keep, or use, within the Jurisdiction aforesaid, any Trammell or Hood-Net whatfoever for catching of Fish, not being Three Inches at the least in the Mesh, upon Pain to

forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

10. Item, That no Person thall lay, set or place any Weels, except Greg Weels, in the River Thames, between the First Day of March, and the First Day of July yearly, upon the Penalty of forfeiting and paying Forty Shillings for every such Offence.

11. Item, That no Person shall use any Weels,

called a Loom or Mill-Pot, or any other Device or Engine, with the Head thereof against the Stream in the said River Thames, or Waters of Medway, except only the Head Weels in the Fishing-Stops; and that no Person shall use or have in his Possession any Net, called a Purse-Net, or Casting-Net, upon pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every such Offence.

12. Item, That no Person shall fish with any Kind of Net, or use any Angle Rod with more than Two Hooks upon a Line, or faw or fcratch for Barbel, or use any Engine or Device for taking Fish nearer unto London Bridge than Botolph Wharf, and the Bridge-House Wharf on the East Side, or nearer unto the West Side than St. Mary Overy's Stairs and the Old Swan, under the Penalty of forfeiting and and paying Ten Shillings for every such Offence.

13. Item, That no Person shall fish or work for Smelts upon or in the River of Thames, Westward of London Bridge, with any Net of less Size than One Inch and a Quarter in the Mesh, nor further Westward in the faid River than Richmond Bridge, with any Manner of Net; and that no Person shall fish or work for Gudgeons Westward of Richmond Bridge in the faid River (except by Angling or by Weels) upon Pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

14. Item, That no Person shall at any Time of the Year take the Tides, or pouse or use, or have in his Possession, any Pousing-Net upon the River Thames, under the Penalty of forfeiting and pay-

ing Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

15. Item, That no Person shall take at any Time of the Year any Sort of Fish which are usually called Kettle Fish, nor any Sort of Fish usually called White Bait, upon Pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every such Offence: It appearing to this Court that, under Pretence of taking White Bait, the small Fry of various Species of Fish are destroyed.

16. Item, That no Net under the Affize of Three Inches in the Mesh shall be worked or wrought by any Person at any Time of the Year, above Richmond Bridge upon the River of Thames; and that no Person shall use any Net in the Work of Fishing called beating of the Bush, Flag or Reed, which shall be of less Size than Three Inches in the Mesh; or shall use or load their Nets with any Stones, Lead, Iron, Bricks, or other Things, than the Lead which is usually put upon the same to sink them, under the Penalty to forseit and pay Five Pounds for every such Offence.

17. Item, That no Net, Engine or Device shall be wrought or drawn over the Weeds for catching of Pikes, or other Fish, by any Person, under the Penalty to forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

18. Item, That no Person shall bend any Net by Anchors, or otherwise shwart the Channel, or draw any other Net, Engine or Device into, upon or near it, or use any Net with any false or double Bottom, Cod or Pouch, upon Pain to forseit and pay Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

19. Item, That no Weel, called a Kill or Sperti or any other Engine (except Greg-Weels) shall be laid, fet or placed in any Lane or Channel, Stop or Gull upon the River of Thames, between the First Day of March, and the First Day of July, in

any Year, upon the Penalty to forfeit and pay Forty Shillings for every fuch Offence. 20. Item, That no Person shall sish, or attempt to take Fish with any Sort of Net, in the Night-time; or before Sun-rising, or after Sun-setting, at any Time of the Year, in the faid River Thames, between Richmond Bridge and the City of London's Mark Stone above Staines Bridge, under the Penalty of forfeiting and paying Five Pounds for every such

21. Item, That no Person shall use any Draw-Net, or draw any Net, although of legal Size or Mesh, upon, before or after any other Net or Nets; and that no Person shall land or ship into any Boat on Shore, any Net in any Part of the said River Westward of Richmond Bridge, under the Penalty of forfeiting and paying Five Pounds for every such Offence.

22. Item, That Shads shall only be taken in the said River of Thames, Westward of London Bridge, with a Drag, or Drove-Nets, and Eastward of London-Bridge with fingle Nets, or Drag or Drove-Nets; and that every fingle Net and Drag Net shall be Two Inches and a Half at least in the Mesh; and that every Drove-Net shall be Three Inches and a Half in the Mesh at least, under the Penalty of forfeiting and paying Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

23. Item, That the respective Times and Seasons for Persons going forth to fish, and taking Fish in the said River of Thames, and Waters of Medway, shall from Time to Time be observed by them, and be

as follows; that is to fay:

FLOUNDERS, Shall be taken all the Year, (except between Hall Haven on the Essex Shore, and Fishnesse on the Kentish Shore, in the River of Thames, and the City Stone in the Waters of Medway, between the Twenty-first Day of December and the Twenty-first of February, in

every Year. SMELTS, Shall be only taken Eastward of Pursleet, from the First Day of November to the Twentyfifth Day of March; and Westward of Pursleet, from the Twenty-fifth Day of March to the First

Day of May, in every Year. SHADS, Shall be only taken from the Tenth Day of May to the Thirtieth Day of June, in every Year.

SALMON, Shall be only taken from the Twentyfifth Day of January to the Tenth Day of Sep2 tember, yearly.

TROUT, Shall only be taken from the Twenty-fifth Day of January to the Tenth Day of September,

yearly. PIKE, JA JÁCK DACE, CHUB, BARBEL, and GUDGEONS,

Shall be only taken between PEARCH, ROACH, the First Day of July and the First Day of March in every Year, except such as shall be taken in the Month

Jof June by Angling.

LEAPS and RODS Shall be laid only from the for EELS, Twenty-first Day of April to the Thirtieth Day of October yearly.

L'AMPERNS, Shall only be taken from the Twentyfourth Day of August to the Thirtieth Day of March yearly.
WHITINGS, Shall be only taken from Michaelmass

day, yearly, to Ember Week.

WHITE

WHITE SHRIMPS, Shall be only taken from the / Flew or Stream Nets, of the Dimensions before de-Twenty-fourth Day of August, yearly, to the Twenty-fifth Day of March.

RED SHRIMPS, Shall be taken in the River Medway only, and that from the Twenty-fifth Day of April, yearly, to the First Day of July.

BUNTINGS, Shall only be taken from the First Day of September, yearly, to the First Day of April. HOOKERMEN, May hook for Eels all the

STOW BOATS. Trowlermen, Trinkermen, Hebbermen, Draggermen, and Bandingmen, may lay Leaps for Eels and Smelts during the Time and in the Season hereby allowed for taking fuch Fish respectively.

And any Person who shall catch any Fish within the Jurisdiction aforesaid, in any other Season of the Year, or in any other Manner, shall forfeit and pay for every such Offence the Sum of Five Pounds.

24. Item, That no Fish of any of the Sorts or Kinds hereinafter mentioned, shall be caught in the said River of Thames, or Waters of Medway, or fold, or exposed to or for Sale, if caught in the faid River of Thames, or Waters of Medway, of less Weight or Size than hereinafter is specified, (that is to fay)

No Salmon of less Weight than Six Pounds; No Trout of less Weight than One Pound;

No Pike or Jack under Twelve Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Pearch under Eight Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Flounder under Seven Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Sole under Seven Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Plaice or Dab under Seven Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Roach under Eight Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Dace under Six Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Smelt under Six Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Gudgeon under Five Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Whiting under Eight Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

No Barbel under Twelve Inches long, from the Eve to the End of the Tail;

No Chub under Nine Inches long, from the Eye to the End of the Tail;

under Pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.

25. Item, That no Person shall in anywise use or practice Trinking, Stow-boating, Trawling or catching of any Fish or Bait in the said River of Thames, Waters of Medway, on any Lord's Day, commonly called Sunday, under the Penalty of forfeiting and paying for every such Offence Forty Shillings.

26. Item, That no Person shall have, use or employ any Trawle-Net that shall not be Three Inches at the Head and Two Inches and a Half at the Cod; and that all Nets already made shall be taken off at Three Score Mesh, and knit down to Two Inches and a Half, upon Pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds

for every such Offence.

27. Item, That no Person shall begin to fish or work upon any Trayle before the Sixth Day of October yearly, or shall fish or work upon any Trayle after the Thirtieth Day of March in any Year, upon pain to forfeit and pay Forty Shillings for every fuch

28. Item, That no Person using any Season in buying and felling of Fish, shall put out his Flag before he hath bought, upon Pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every fuch Offence.
29. Item, That no Net shall be drawn by any

Person between Two Boats, except Salmon Nets, and long; and every Warp shall be Sixty Fathom long,

fcribed; but that no fuch Salmon Net shall at any Time of the Year be wrought or worked in any Gull or Stream of the River, and the Stream Nets to be used Westward of Richmond Bridge only, from the First Day of July to the First Day of March in every Year; and not to be loaded with more than the usual Weight of Lead to fink them, upon Pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds for every such Offence.

30. Item, That no Trinke shall stand for Smelts between the First Day of May and the Thirty-first Day of October yearly, upon Pain to forfeit and pay Five Pounds.

31. Item, That no Trinke of any Person shall stand to fish for Smelts longer than from Monday Morning until Friday Night Weekly, unless it be in Lent Time, and then to fland every Day (except the Lord's, Day, commonly called Sunday) upon Pain to forseit and pay Forty Shillings for every such Offence.

32. Item, That every Trinke shall keep its true Complement, and stand in the several Places and Manner hereinaster directed; and that no Trinke of any Person shall stand in any Birth or Turn, or more at any Place than is hereafter allowed; that is to fay:

At Blackwall Ferry, Two a-breast a-front and no

more

At Leigh Shelpe, Two and no more; At Woolwich Shelpe, Two and no more; At Woolwich Town, Five and no more; At Gallions Naffe, Three and no more; At Bufward's Bufh, Five and no more;

At the East and West End of Barking Shelpe, Two

at each Place, and no more; At Daggenhem Shelpe, Six and no more;

At Careck, Four and more;

At Julian Tree Jobb, Three and no more;

At Dartford Jobb, Three and no more;

At the Bite at East Nasse, Three and no more; \_At Stakes Fleet Nasse, alias Stakes End, Five and no more

At Avely Hold, Five and no more;

At Purfleet, Five and no more;

At Gray Thorocke, Six and no more: At the Two Thoroughs, Three and no more; upon Pain to forfeit and pay Forty Shillings for every

fuch Offence.

. Item, That no Owner or Worker of any Trinke, shall stand to fish with his Trinke, or suffer his Trinke, or any Person therein, to fish for Whitings, at any other. Season than herein before is appointed or allowed, or shall come higher than Pursleet: And that the Hole of the Cod of every one of the Nets, which shall be, used by or in any such. Trinke, "shall be a full Inch and an Half wide; and that the Owner or Worker of every such Trinke shall, upon every Saturday, at the Sun-rising at the farthest, wash off his Net, haul up, and not return to his Labour 'till Monday Morning at Day-light: And that no Owner or Worker of any Trinke fland to fish, or be allowed to fish, before any Breach Mouth, at the rifing or finking of any Mother Fishes, or in the Time of Spawn or Brood of Fish: And that the Owner or Worker of every Trinke shall, at all Times and Seasons, take up and carry away the Anchors belonging to fuch Trinke, at the Time of his leaving off Fishing, and not leave any of his Anchors behind him to keep his Birth, upon Pain to forfeit and pay Forty. Shillings for every such Offence.

34. Item, That the Owner of every Trinke shall, in every dark and foggy Night, hang forth out of his said Trinke Boat one Lanthern, with a sufficient Candle-light, for the better and fafer Passage of Ships, Boats and Vessels passing to and fro; and that the Trinke Cable of every Trinke shall be no more than Twenty-five Fathom long at the most; and none of their Henbuilt shall be above Twenty-five Fathom

and no more, to sheer off and give Way if any Ship, Crayer, or other Vessel shall chance to drive upon them, upon Pain to forfeit and pay Forty Shillings

for every fuch Offence.

35.
