#### St. James's, November 26.

HIS Day Intelligence was received from Vienna of the melancholy Event of the Death of His Serene Highne's Prince George of Mecklenburgh Strelitz, youngeft Brother to the Queen, which happened on the 6th of this Month, at Tyrnau in Hungary.

#### Whitehall, November 29.

The King has been pleafed to grant to the Reverend William Welfitt, Doctor in Divinity, the Place and Dignity of a Canon or Prebendary of the Metropolitical Church of Canterbury, void by the Death of the Reverend Doctor Richard Sutton.

The King has been pleafed to grant to Hayward Jeaffrefon, of Bramford in the County of Suffolk, Gentleman, and his Iffue, His Royal Licence and Authority to affume and take the Surname of Haward only; and alfo to order, that this His Majefty's Conceffion and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

The Letters are intended to be fent out regularly from hence between the Hours of Nine and Ten in the Morning, fo as to reach the most diftant Parts of the Town by Twelve at Noon.

It is neceffary that all Newspapers should be put into this Office before Six o'Clock, otherwise they cannot be certain of an immediate Conveyance.
