The Profefforthips are open to Protestants of all Nations, provided they have taken Medical Degrees. Each Professorihip will become vacant at the End of Seven Years from the Date of the Election; but at the Expiration of the faid Seventh Year, the fame Profession may be again elected. The Electors are bound to the firstfell Impartiality, by an Oath required by the faid Act, to be taken by every Elector previous to the Election.
