

## SCHOOL OF PHYSICiIN IRELAND.

WEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed in Ireland this Seffion, intituledje"An AAt for eftablißhing a ${ }^{6 \prime}$ complete School of Phyicic ins this Kingdom," it is enacted, That feveral Profeflorthips fiall be eftablifhed, namely, a Profefiorithip of the Inftitutes of Médicine, a Profefforfhip of the Practice of Medicine, ard a Profefforhip of the Materia Medica, Pharmacy and Natural Hiftory, and that the Three Profeffors of the faid feveral Branches fhall be called the King's Profesgors, in the City of Dubine, ON THE FOUNDATION OF Sir Patrick Dunn: And alfo that Three Lecturébips; long fince eftablifhed in the Univerfity of this Kingdom, for the teaching of Anatomy and Surgery, Chemitity and Botany, fhall be Univerfity Profefforfhips in the faid feveral Branches refpectively; and that the faid reveral Profefforhips thall have perpetual Continuance.

And whereas the faid Act of Parlitment reguired that, previous to every Election, unlefs when it fhould be thought proper to continue the fame-Profeffors, Three Months Notice fhould be given in the Dublin and London Gazectes; and whereas fuch Notice hath not been given: Now Notice is hereby given, that the Election of King's Profeffiors in the City of Dublin on the Foundation of Sir Pataicx Dunst, will be held at the Houfe of the Proyoft of Trinity College, Dublin, on Tuefday the 2t of 'March, 3786, after' (uish Examination as the Electots may require, which will begin att the Hour of Ten o'Clock' in the Morning of the faid Day.
The following Emoluments and Advantages attend thefe Profeflorfhips.
Each Profeffor will receive the yearly Sum of One Hundred Pbundsy (to commence at the Time of his Election,) and alfo may charge reafonable Fees, to be paid by all fuch Perfons as attend the refpective Lectures; the faid Fees to be paid on Admiffion, and to be, from Time to Time, regulated by the King and Quecn's College of Phyficians in Ireland.
The Lectures of each Profeffor are to commence on the Firf Monday in Novernber, and to continue until the End of April, and are to be given Four Days in the Week \{at leaft in Trinity College, Dublin. They are alfo to be delivered in the Englifh tanguage, unlefs it be otherwife ordered by the Prefident and Fellows of the faid College of Phyficians. Clinical Lectures will be eftablithed, and cevery Affiftance and Encouragement given for the Succefs and Advancement of Medical Inftruction in the faid School of Phyfic.
The Profeftorfhips are open to Proteftants of all Nations, providedighey have taken Medical Degrees. Each Profefforfhip will become vacant at the End of Seven Years. from the Date of the Election; but at the Expiration of the faid Seventh Year, the fame Profeffor may be again elected. The Electors are bound to the ftricteft Impartiality, by an Oath required by the Gaid ACt, to be taken by every Elector previous to the Election.
It is defred that all Percons, intending to offer themfelves as Candidates for any of the faid Profefforfhips, do, within Two Months from the Date hereof, fend their Names, and allo an Account of the Places of their Education, of the Univerfities in.which they have taken their Medical Degrees, and of the Places in which they have practifed, to the Rev. Henry Dabzac, D. D. Trinity College, and to Stephen Dickron, Efq; M. D. Peter-fteet, Dublin, who will give any further Information on the Subject that may be necelfary.
