" If you do not difcharge those Men you now " imply and take in your oun as beefore You and your Houfes and Warehoufes will be committed

" to the Flames, it is better for two or three Men to " die than all Perifh."

PALMER bawing engaged to accomplifs his Plan for the Conveyance of His Majefty's Mails to all Parts of the Kingdom as foon as pollibles the Letters for every Part of Great Britain and Ire-land, must be put into the Receiving Houses before FIVE o'Clock in the Evening, and into this Office before SEVEN, in order to prevent the Inconveni-encies which have arifen to the Public from Two Deliveries in London on the fame Day, and the fending out the Mails at different Hours on the fame Evening.

The Letters are intended to be fent out regularly from bence between the Hours of Nine and Ten in the Morning, fo as to reach the most diftant Parts of the Town by Twelve at Neen.

It is necessary that all Newspapers should be put into this Office before Six o'Clock, otherwife they cannot be certain of an immediate Conveyance.
