Mirch ints, Owners, Masters, Pilots, and others concern d, that, in pursuance of the said Act, all Vessels who'ly or partly laden with Tobacco, which may arr.ve in this Port, from and after the faid 1st Day of January next, are required to moor in the faid Births or Tiers accordingly, and not to depart therefrom until regularly cleared by the proper Officer or Officers of His Majesty's Customs, under a Penalty of Fifty Pounds. And the several Owners and Masters of the Vessels now moored in those Births or Tiers (except Tobacco Ships) are hereby required to remove such Vessels therefrom, fo that they may not impede or interrupt any Ship laden or partly laden with Tobacco, from coming to the faid Chains after the before-mentioned Period, as no other than Tobacco Ships can legally be suffered to remain at those Places after that Time.
