

Whitehall, January 16, 1786.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Saturday the 7th Instant, between the Hours of Ten and Eleven at Night, as Joseph Treacher, of the Parish of St. Olave Southwark, Farrier, was passing over St. George's Fields, he was met near the King's Arms Public House by Two Men, who attempted to rob him of his Watch, and, upon his refusing to deliver the same, one of them fired a Pistol at him, the Ball from which entered his Head, and he now lies dangerously ill in Consequence thereof.
