THIS Day being appointed for the Celebration of the Anniversary of the Queen's Birth-day, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, to compliment Their Majesties on the Occasion. The Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock. There was a Ball at Court in the Evening, and Illuminations, and other public Demonstrations of Joy, in London and Westminster.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the Persons on board the said Smuggling Cutter, who will discover his Accomplices therein, (except the Person who actually fired the said Swivel Gun,) so that they, or any of them, may be apprehended and convicted thereof. And, as a further Encouragement, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs do hereby promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted) to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs, on the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
