

WHereas a Quantity of Specie was lost by the Overfetting of the Boat belonging to the Ceres, Captain Fletcher, wrecked near Rochevauille on the Coast of France in December last, on her late Voyage from Boston to London, and which, by the Diligence of Mess. Delporte, sen. and Brother, Merchants at Boulogne, with the Assistance of the Officers of the Admiralty of Abbeville, has been happily recovered out of the Sands, where it some Time lay buried, or the greatest Part of it: This is to give Notice to all Persons that may have any Claims thereto, or to any Part thereof, that if they will send their Bills of Lading or Receipts, or any other Papers tending to prove their Right therein, to Mess.
