The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to make the following Amendment upon the Roll of Sheriffs, viz.

His Majesty, by His Royal Letters, having appointed Charles Dillon, Esq; now called Charles Dillon Lee, to be of His Most Honourable Privy Council of this Kingdom, he this Day in Council took the usual Oaths, and his Place at the Board accordingly.

- Ditto, Reverend Miles Beever to be Chaplain, vice Church, resigned.
- 4th Regiment of Foot, Lieutenant James Wilson, from British Half-Pay of the late 86th Regiment, to be Lieutenant, vice Grant, exchanged.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Sunday the 26th Day of February last, between Nine and Ten o'Clock in the Evening; George Tantt, Coachman to Laurence Holker, Esq; of the Parish of Bexley in the County of Kent, having driven his said Master Home from a Neighbour's House where he had dined, and having put up his Horses in the Stable, which is immediately across the Road, and within a Hundred Yards of his said Master's House, (having a Lanthorn with a lighted Candle in it,) he was, suddenly and without any Words being spoken, shot at; that he just saw a Man fire, but could not perceive whether it was from a Gun or Pistol; that he had no distinct View of the Man so as to know him again. That the Lanthorn was shot from out of his Hand, which he found in the Road the next Morning much shattered; and that upon his crying out "Murder," the Person who shot at him immediately ran away.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in firing at the said George Tantt as abovementioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually fired) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or any one of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
