backs are allowed and paid, or are fubject and liable to by Law, upon the Exportation of fuch Hemp and Iron into other Foreign Parts.

And His Majefly is hereby further pleafed to order, That any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported, in Manner before-mentioned, upon Payment of the fame Duties as Tobacco, imported by Britilh Subjects from any Britilh Colony or Plantation, is or may be fubject to, but under and fubject nevertheles to all and fingular the Regulations of an Act made and paffed in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefly, initialed, "An Act for the better "fecuring the Duties physicale on Tobacco." And His Majefly is further pleafed to order, That any Rice being the Growth or Production of new of the Territorian of the United States of

of any of the Territories of the United States of America, which shall be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down in ready Money the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy (except as hereinafter excepted) be warehoused under His Majesty's Locks, in such Warehouses as shall be approved of for that Purpose by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of all further Duties due for fuch Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Rice at the Time it fhall be fo landed: But it is His Majefly's Pleafure, neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Rice into the Ports of London, Brittol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Poole, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, (until further Older) to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the faid Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all the further Duties due for such Rice, but without any Allowance for prompt Payment of the faid Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy, or any other of the Duties which were formerly payable in ready Money; and that if any Rice, which shall be to imported from the Territories of the faid United States, shall be taken within the Time herein before mentioned out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be secured under His Majesty's Locks; in Man-ner herein before directed, at any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or at either of the Ports above-mentioned respectively, as the Cafe may be, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which shall be entered into for Payment of the faid Duties thall be discharged, in like Manner as Bonds entered into for the Duties upon Tobacco are directed to be difcharged by any Act of Parliament in Force.

And for the Purpole of regulating the Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, in the Weff-Indies, in which Defeription the Bahama Iflands and the Bermuda or Somers Hands are included; and the People and Territories belonging to the faid United States of America, His Majeffy is hereby further pleafed to order, that no Goods or Commodities whatfoever, except Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Hemp and Flax, Mafts, Yards and Bowfprits, Staves, Heading Boards, Timber, Shingles, and all other Species of Lumber; Horles, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions, Peas, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat,

Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain, being the Growth or Pro-duction of any of the faid United States of America; and also Tobacco in the fair and lawful Way of Barter and Traffic, between the People of the faid United States and the People of His Majefty's Weft India Islands, as permitted by the before-recited Act paffed in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, may be imported from any of the faid United States of America into any of His Majefty's faid West-India Islands, and that the above Goods may, until further Order, be imported by British Subjects only, and in no other than British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law; and that Rum, Sugar, Melaffes, Coffee, Cocoa-Nuts, Ginger and Pimento may, (until further Order) be exported by British Subjects, in Britilh-built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the faid Islands to any Port or Place within the fain United States, upon Payment of the fame Duties od Exportation, and fubject to the like Rules, Regulations, Securities and Reftrictions, as the fame Articles by Law are or may be fubject and liable to, if exported to any British Colony or Plantation in America; and the Bonds and Securities heretofore required to be taken for fuch Ships carrying fuch Goods shall and may be cancelled and discharged, upon the like Certificates as are required by the faid recited Act made in the Twenty-third Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, to difcharge any Bonds given in Great. Britain for the due landing any other Goods in the faid United States of America.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that no Goods or Commodities, being the Growth or Manufacture of the faid United States, shall be imported into the Provinces of Nova Scotia or New Brunswick, cr their respective Dependencies, except Horfes, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provisions; Peas, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Bif-cuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain; alfo Lumber of every Sort; and that the above Articles shall be imported by British Subjects only, and in none other than British-built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and during such limitted Times only as the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the faid Provinces, and their respective Dependencies, shall, with the Advice of their respective Councils, by Proclamation declare the Importa-tion of any of the faid Articles to be neceflary for the Supply of the Inhabitants of the faid Provinces. And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that no Goods or Commodities of the Growth or Manafacture of the faid United States shall be imported into any of the Ports of the Province of Quebec.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefly's Treafury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. Steph, Cottrell.
