THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Robert Quarme, Esq; Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for vesting certain Sums in Commissioners, at the End of every Quarter of a Year, to be by them applied to the Reduction of the National Debt.

An Act for raising a certain Sum of Money, by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-six.

An Act for raising a further Sum of Money, by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-six.

An Act for altering the Days of Payment of the Long Annuities, and Annuities for Thirty and Twenty-nine Years.

An Act to explain, amend, and render more effectual, an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act to explain, amend, and render more effectual, an Act passed in the Twenty-third Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for authorizing the Treasurer of the Navy to pay to the Garrison and Naval Department of Gibraltar the like Bounty for destroying certain Spanish Ships of War, as is allowed to the Officers and Men on board any of His Majesty's Ships of War taking or destroying Ships of War belonging to the Enemy.

An Act to explain an Act, made in the last Session of Parliament, with Respect to the Allowances to be made for Waste on the Exportation of White Salt and Rock Salt to the Isle of Man; for limiting the Quantity of British Refined Sugar to be exported to the Isle of Man; and for repealing so much of an Act, made in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for encouraging and regulating the Trade and Manufacture of the Isle of Man, and for the more easy Supply of the Inhabitants there with a certain Quantity of Wheat, Barley, Oats, Meal, and Flour, authorized by an Act made in this Session, to be transported to the said Island, as relates to permitting any Person to import into the Isle of Man Fish from any Place whatever, except from Great Britain, without Payment of any Custom or other Duty whatsoever.

An Act for regulating the Time of the Imprisonment of Debtors imprisoned by Process from Courts instituted

for the Recovery of Small Debts; for abolishing the Claim of Fees of Gaolers, and others, in Cases of such Imprisonment; and for ascertaining the Qualifications of the Commissioners.

An Act for laying a Toll upon all Horses and Carriages passing on a Sunday over Black-Friars Bridge, and for applying the Money to arise thereby towards increasing the Fund for watching, lighting, cleansing, watering, and repairing the said Bridge.

We take this Opportunity to give You this warning of Your danger for Your behaviour in breaking the prices of the poors work and if You do not amend Your ways and put on what You have unjustly taken of the wages, we are determined that within the Space of One Month upwards of One hundred of us have made an Oath and entred into a Bond that if you do not retrac from what You have done that we will set Your warehouse in fire about your ears and for Yourself wherever we can find You and Your Accomplices we shall make you suffer for what You have done and likeways we hear in the Newspapers that You and Your combined begerly Crew are designed to oppose the operative Weavers but because You think if that pass into a Law Youl be prevented from breaking the Prices by reason the workmen will not be so plenty, likeways we hear whenever any person Complains of his prices to his Master they will tell him to go to Mulrie sword or Bartholemews Warehouse and see there regulations that they are less by this we learn that You Damn'd Rascalls are always the first to break the prices so by this if You have any regard for Your safety You will take Warning both Your and Your Accomplices You Loufy Rougues that comes from nothing and wants to make rich but we will soon deprieve You of that for we are desgned to put in execution what what we have sworn to take warning Mulrie Sword Bartholemew Sweet Dennisloan Crum and all You that has the most active hand in so doing.
