At Noon there was a very numerous Affembly of the Nobility, and other Perfons of Diffinction, of both Sexes, at the Caftle, who appeared in great Splendor, to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant, before whom an Ode, fet to Mufic, was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Grace to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonftrations of Joy throughout the City.
