Riga, January 7.

Efferdsy we had advice, that Count Horne was arrived at Narva, and that he will be here in few days. On the 9th inflant the States of this Province will be affembled here, and on the 17th is appoint-

ed the general Rendezvous of their Army, which will be composed of 1 2000 Men Horse and Foot, and in a elay or two after they will begin to march towards Pruffis. From Mofco they tell us, that they had advice from Conffantinople of the great preparations making by the Turks against them ; that the Grim Tartars had received a command from the Grand Signior to fall into Molcovy, and that feveral great parties had made incursions into the Ukraine; that the Grand Signior had caufed Ibrahim Baffa to be strangled, for his ill conduct before *Checherin*, where the Turks Army was lately defeated; that the Czar was fending an Envoye to constantinople, to endeavor to compose matters \$ but there feemed little hopes of his fucceeding in his Errand; So that we are now very much at eafe by being freed from the apprehensions we had formerly of fome disturbance from the Moscovites.

Vienna, Fan. 27 The Marriage between the Duke of Lorrain and the Queen Dowager of Polandy will be confummated on Sunday next, he paffed by this place in his way to Neu/fadt; he hath been carried from Philipsburg to Ratisbonne in a Litter, not being able to go on Horseback, because of the wound he received by a fall at Philipsburg, of which he is not yet quite secovered. It has been generally believed that Count Montecuculi would command the Emperors Army the next Campagne, but now it is reported that the Duke of Lorrain goes to the Army again prefently after the Celebration of his Marriage. The Chiaus who came Celebration of his Marriage. The Chiaus who came from Bada, had yesterday his Audience of General Heicher, Vice-Prefident of the Council of War; he complaineth much against the Hussirs, who go out in great parties daily, and defires fatisfaction for the damages which the Turks of Neuhaufil fuffered lately near Leboniz, and that those Turks as were then made priloners, may be reftored. Two Couriers arrived here yefferday, the one from the States of sile fia, and the other from the Elector of Brandenburg. This lacter reports, that that Elector hath fent feveral thousands of men towards Denmirk for that Kings fervice. Two days ago returned from the Court of Bavaria Monfieur Fortner, one of the Counfel Aulique, and it is faid now, that there is no fear that that Elector will break with the Emperor. From Breslan they write, that they have accepted the Emperors Project of an Excize to be fet upon Beer, Bread, Wine, Lead, Flesh, Uc.

Dantzicke, Jan. 29. All the endeavors which the King of Poland hath been pleafed to use for the accommodating the matters in difference between the Magistrates and the Burghers of this City, have hitherto wanted the defired effect, and the minds of men seem so exasperated, that we might with great reason apprehend the ill confequence of it, were it not for the prefence of the King, which keeps things from breaking out into any publick diforder.

ing out into any publick diforder. Copenbagen, Febr. 2. In Schonen the Suedes have taken every fifth man to ferve in their Army, which they fay will be much greater this next Campagne than it hath been yet during this present War. We are told likewife that they are using all the endeavors posfible to bring their Fleet to Sea again, being refolved to try their fortune once more in an Engagement with our Naval Force. It is faid here, that of the Troops which were defeated in the Ifle of Rugen by Counc Coning fmarke, not above 6 or 700 were Danes, the reft being Auxiliaries fent by the Emperor, the Elector of Brandenburg, the Dukes of Lunenburg, and the Landgrave of Heffe. We are endeavouring to recover that lofs by making new Levies, for which the neceffary Commillions are difpatching, and the Troops which had their quarters in the Dutchy of Holftein, are ordered to march this way, and will, as is faid, be tranf-ported to schonen. The Suedes have lately executed two Burghets of Elfenbarg, for holding intelligence with their Enemy,

Strasburg, Febr. 7. From Nancy we have advice; that the French. was very fuddenly expected there with the Queen and the whole Court; that the Marefchal de Crequi returned thither from Paris the 5th inflant; that the French Troops which are quarted in Lorrain, have orders to march. Lieutenant General Menelus affembles 4 or 5000 men, with what defign we know not, unlefs it be to execute fuch places as are behind hand in their Contributions. Count Caprara is arrived at Offenburg, where he is to command. The Imperial Troops which are quartered in the Honfrucke have orders to hold themfelves ready to march upon the first orders. It is faid the Molt Christian King will come to Brifac. All thefe parts are full of expectation to fee what it is that brings that King this way.

Ditto. We are now pretty well rid of the fears we were in, that the French were preparing for an attempt to deftroy our Bridge ; fince we understand, that the Veffels and Materials which they had brought together for the making a Bridge, as we thought between Schlefladt and Benfelt, have been removed to Brifie. We are fomewhat furprized at the news we receive that the French have on the fudden, discontinued working on the new Fortifications which they were making at Friburg, and on the other hand they begin to demolish Buschweyler and Neuingen ; and, it's believed they will do the like to other places, and keep onely Schleftadt and Brifee. We hear that a great many Troops are on their march from Burgundy towards Brifas; and on the other fide, feveral Troops are marching from. Marfel towards Sedan.

Cologne, Febr. 10. Yesterday we had an account that a party of the Garison of Matsfricht on Tuesday last made an incursion into Exffest, and ravaged the Country; that particularly they had plundered a fmall fmall Town called Kyl, where a Company of Munflemans was quartered, who were all made prifoners by the French, but afterwards fiript and let go, except the Officers, who they carried with them to *Maeffricht*. The Baron of *Stractman*, one of the Emperors Ambaffidors and Plenipotentiaries for the Treaty at Nimeguen, is come to *Dufeldorp*, to confer with the Duke of Neuburg concerning feveral matters.

of Neuburg concerning feveral matters. Bruffels, Febr. 8. Since my last a party of French have burnt all the Water Mills about Mons, and broken down all the Bridges, even within thot of their Cannon, which very much alarmed the Duke d'Aerfchot, who immediately fent an Express hither to give the Duke de Villa Hermofa an account of what had happened, and did believe that what the Enemy had done, was in order to the belieging the place; upon which his Excellency commanded the Regiment of Belvedere to march immediately from hence to Hall, to remiorce the Garifon that is there 3 but the French having executed their orders, retired again. We are told that the Bishop of Munster is going to encrease his Troops to the number of 2000 men, which gives us here fome jealoufie. The last night the Prince of Vaudemont, in confideration of the marriage of the Duke of Lorrain with the Queen Dowager of Poland, made a Ball to all the Ladies and Men of Quality that are here, and the Cannon by his Excellencies order were thrice discharged. We are told from Lille, that all the Pioneers which were fummoned in, are countermanded. The States of the Province of Luxemburg have conferred to raife and pay 3500 Foot, and 300 Horfe.

Ditto, Febr. 11. Yesterday Monsieur Dickfeild gave a great entertainment to all the Foreign Ministers and Perfons of Quality of this Court ; at the fame time there were feveral Fireworks on the Sabloon, and all the Artillery of the Town was thrice difcharged, in complement to the Prince of Oranges matriage. The French are at prefent very quiet in thefe parts, but we are fomewhat alarmed with the news we receive from Paris of the Kings departure from thence rowards Germany. It is faid that the Army which he defigns to act with in those parts, will confist in above 60000 men, and that the King will not be abroad above fix weeks, but purpofes to be back at St. Germains the latter end of the next month. We are in much apprehension for Luxemburg or Trier, the Garifons of which places have therefore been confiderably reinforced, and particularly two Munfter Regiments are entred into Lazemburg. Our Northern Letters speak of some other advantages gained by the Suedes in Schonen fince that obrained by Count Coning marke in Rugen, which has very much changed the face of affairs in those parts. From Italy they write, that the Duke of Bournonville hath been obliged to quit the Siege of Taormina.

Antwerp, Febr. 11. In these Provinces the French ravage and destroy all the Country, that the Confederate Troops when they take the Field may nor be able to subsist. They have lately burnt all the Mills about Mons to incommode that Ciry. The Count de Montal, Governor of Charleroy, being abroad with a strong party of Horse, hath burnt and destroyed all the Forage about Namur, upon which the Prince of Barbancon Governor of Namur, intended to go out with 1200 Foot, 400 Horse, and 300 Dragoons, to take his revenge,

Hague, Febr. ID. The 8th inflant in the evening their Highneffes returned bither from Soefidike, and the next morning all the General Officers here in

Town were to attend his Highnefs, and to receive orders from him in feveral matters. The 9th, the States of Holland affembled, and the fame day the Deputies of the Admiralty had a Conference with those of the States. The Letters we received the last night from Bruffels, fay, that the French appeared again about Mons, and gave caufe to believe that they intended a Siege of it.

Ditto, Febr. 15. We have Letters from Tobago in the Weft Indies, dated the 13th of Offober, which fay, that the Sieur Binches, as well as many of his men, had been very fickly, but they were perfectly recovered 3 that they were provided with Victuals, and all things neceffary, and were in a very good pofture of defence. Our French Letters bring us the certainty of the French Kings departure from St. Germains towards Nancy, and at the fame time tell us, that he has fome greac defign in hand.

Paris, Febr. 16. We are told, that upon the repeated inflances of the Magistrates of Strasbourg, the Suisse Cancons bad refolved to affif them with some Men to put into the Forcs which guard their Bridge on the Rbine, but the French having complained to the faid Cantons, that the faid City of Strasburg, contrary to what they were obliged to by their Neutrality, have at feveral times granted paffage over their Bridge to the Imperial Army, to the great prejudice of the Kings affairs, the faid Cantons had thereupon changed their refolution. It is faid that though the Mareschal de la Femillade be gone from Thoulom for Melinay, yet that the Troops which were at first intended to have been from the the till Monday lass, having had feveral affairs to dispatch when the Court fet out; he is gone to attend the King, who was to lodge the lass inght at Foinville in Lorrain; we expect now im few days to hear what the Kings defign is, many are of opimion that it is intended against Luxemburg. We have Letters from some Officers in Flanderi, which fay, that a great number of Pioneers was funmoned in by the Mareschaft d'Humiers for longe great Enterprize.
