Convention for carrying into Effect the Removal of the English Settlers on the Spanish Continent in America, to the District described in the Sixth Article of the late Definitive Treaty between His Majesty and the King of Spain; for a further Extension of the Limits of that District; and for additional Privileges to be allowed to the British Subjects there, was signed this Day, by the Marquis of Carmarthen, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, on the one Part, and by the Chevalier Don Bernardo del Campo, Minister Plenipotentiary from His Catholick Majesty, on the other.

Whitehall, July 18.
The King has been pleased to grant to the Reverend Thomas Shaw, of Woodhouse, in the Parish of Wombourn in the County of Stafford, Clerk, and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname and Arms of Hellier, pursuant to the last Will of Sir Samuel Hellier, late of Woodhouse aforesaid, Knt. deceased, such Arms being sirst duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Vienna, July 5.
