**Y**ESTERDAY the Russian Envoy, M. de Mordinoff, presented his Letters of Recall, and took Leave of the Doge and Senate with the usual Ceremonies, he being appointed in the same Character to the Republick of Venice, for which Place he will depart in a few Days.

Copenhagen, July 11:

The 7th of this Month an Ordinance was published allowing the Importation of Grain into Aggerhus and Christiansand, in national or foreign Vessels, on paying Fifteen Shillings (about Seven Pence Sterling) per Ton. Scotch Meal may also be imported into the District of Christiansand. These Regulations have been adopted, and will subsist till July 1787, on Account of the Appearance of bad Crops this Season in Denmark and Norway.
