To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

YOUR Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, Capital Burgeſſes and Inhabitants of the Borough and Town of Harwich, having returned to Almighty God their unfeigned Thanks and Praises for His Mercy and Goodness in ſo ſignally protecting your Sacred Perſon from the late daring Attempt to aſſaſſinate your Majesty, beg Leave to lay themſelves at your Majesty's Feet, and to offer their Congratulations on your moſt fortunate, and, for your Majesty's Subjects, moſt happy Eſcape.

Senſible of the very great Bleſſings we enjoy under your Majesty's Government, and of the high Obligations we owe to your Majesty's Illuſtrious Houſe, we view the late daring and violent Attack with Horror and Detestation, and we moſt humbly intreat your Majesty's Permiſſion to take this Opportunity to renew our ſincere Profeſſions of Duty, Loyalty and Attachment to your Majesty's Sacred Perſon and Government, and to your Royal and Illuſtrious Houſe; and to add, that it is, and ever will be, our moſt fervent Prayer, that the ſame Divine Providence, which has hitherto ſhielded and protected your Sacred Perſon, may long preſerve and continue your Majesty to a grateful and dutiful People, and make your Reign proſperous and happy.
